## Senate Bill 383

Sponsored by Senator BATES (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Requires trauma centers to report certain information related to cerebrovascular accident for purposes of Oregon Trauma Registry.

2 Relating to emergency medical services; amending ORS 431.623.

## **3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1.** ORS 431.623 is amended to read:

5 431.623. (1) The Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Systems Program is created within the

6 Oregon Health Authority for the purpose of administering and regulating ambulances, training and

7 licensing emergency medical services providers, establishing and maintaining emergency medical

8 systems, including trauma systems, and maintaining the Oregon Trauma Registry, as necessary for

9 trauma reimbursement, system quality assurance and ensuring cost efficiency.

- 10 (2) For purposes of ORS 431.607 to 431.619 and ORS chapter 682, the duties vested in the au-11 thority shall be performed by the Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Systems program.
- 12 (3) The program shall be administered by a director.
- (4) With moneys transferred to the program by ORS 442.625, the director of the program shall
  apply those moneys to:
- 15 (a) Developing state and regional standards of care;
- 16 (b) Developing a statewide educational curriculum to teach standards of care;
- 17 (c) Implementing quality improvement programs;
- 18 (d) Creating a statewide data system for prehospital care; and
- 19 (e) Providing ancillary services to enhance Oregon's emergency medical service system.
- 20 (5)(**a**) The director of the program shall adopt rules for the Oregon Trauma Registry, establish-21 ing:
- 22 [(a)] (A) The information that must be reported by trauma centers;
- 23 [(b)] (**B**) The form and frequency of reporting; and
- 24 [(c)] (C) Procedures and standards for the administration of the registry.
- 25 (b) Rules adopted under paragraph (a)(A) of this subsection must require trauma centers

26 to report on the occurrence of cerebrovascular accident, the outcome of each occurrence and

- 27 other data related to cerebrovascular accident as deemed necessary by the director.
