## Senate Bill 444

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Creates offense of smoking in motor vehicle. Applies to persons in motor vehicle who smoke while person under age of 18 is in motor vehicle. Punishes by maximum fine of \$250 for first offense, \$500 for second offense and \$1,000 for third or subsequent offense.

## 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to smoking in a motor vehicle.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle 5 Code.
  - SECTION 2. (1) A person commits the offense of smoking in a motor vehicle if the person smokes a cigarette, cigar or other form of tobacco in a motor vehicle while a person under 18 years of age is in the motor vehicle.
  - (2) Notwithstanding ORS 810.410, a police officer may enforce this section only if the police officer has already stopped and detained the driver operating the motor vehicle for a separate traffic violation or other offense.
- 12 (3) Smoking in a motor vehicle is a:
  - (a) Class D traffic violation for a first offense.
  - (b) Class C traffic violation for a second offense.
- 15 (c) Class B traffic violation for a third or subsequent offense.
