Senate Bill 474

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Adds raccoon to list of potentially habituated wildlife.

2	Relating to raccoons; amending ORS 496.731.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 496.731 is amended to read:
5	496.731. (1) As used in this section:
6	(a) "Officer" means any person authorized to enforce the wildlife laws pursuant to ORS 496.605
7	496.610 or 496.615.
8	(b) "Potentially habituated wildlife" means bear, cougar, coyote, raccoon and wolf.
9	(2) A person who places, deposits, distributes, stores or scatters food, garbage or any other
10	attractant so as to knowingly constitute a lure, attraction or enticement for potentially habituated
11	wildlife may be issued a written notification by an officer requiring the person to remove the food
12	garbage or other attractant within two days of notification.
13	(3) A person who receives a written notification under subsection (2) of this section shall remove
14	the food, garbage or other attractant as directed.
15	(4) This section does not apply to:
16	(a) Activities related to an agricultural, forestry or ranching operation.
17	(b) Feeding potentially habituated wildlife with the State Fish and Wildlife Director's authori
18	zation. The director may authorize the feeding:
19	(A) In order to prevent damage to private property;
20	(B) In order to mitigate the population loss anticipated by a predicted winter mortality; or
21	(C) As a part of a research or management program.
22	(c) Waste disposal facilities operating in accordance with applicable federal, state and loca
23	laws.
24	(d) Zoos, wildlife refuges and persons that have a permit to keep wildlife in captivity for reha
25	bilitation or other purposes pursuant to ORS 497.228, 497.298 or 497.308.

(5) Nothing in this section affects any provision of ORS 498.164.
