CHAPTER

AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of ORS 291.055 (1)(e), the following new or increased fees, adopted by the State Department of Agriculture and approved by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, are approved:

- Per ton inspection fee for official inspection of fertilizer, agricultural mineral and agricultural amendment\$ 0.45
 Per ton inspection fee for
 - official inspection of gypsum \$ 0.05

<u>SECTION 2.</u> For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of ORS 291.055 (1)(e), a per acre fee for open field burning of \$20, adopted by the State Department of Agriculture and approved by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, is approved.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of ORS 291.055 (1)(e), the following new or increased fees, adopted by the State Department of Agriculture and approved by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, are approved:
