Senate Bill 5507

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Limits for six-year period beginning July 1, 2013, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by various state agencies for capital construction.

Limits expenditures from federal funds collected or received by the Oregon Department of Aviation and Oregon Military Department for capital construction for six-year period beginning July 1, 2013.

Increases expenditure limitations for certain previously authorized projects.

Sets expiration date on project approvals and expenditure limitations. Extends expiration dates for certain projects.

Authorizes sale of bonds under Article XI-G of Oregon Constitution for previously approved projects.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.

The project approvals and expenditure limitations established by section 7 $\mathbf{7}$ (3) and (9), chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, for capital construction or acquisition projects 8 9 at Clackamas Community College and Umpqua Community College expire on June 30, 2015. SECTION 7. Pursuant to Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution, and ORS 341.721 and 10 ORS chapter 286A, the State Treasurer may sell, at the request of the State Board of Edu-11 12cation, general obligation bonds of the State of Oregon of the kind and character and within the limits prescribed by Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution, as the treasurer deter-13 mines, but in no event may the treasurer sell more than the aggregate principal sum of 14 15 \$16,500,000 par value for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013. The moneys realized from the 16 sale of the bonds shall be appropriated and may be expended for the purposes set forth in section 7 (3) and (9), chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, and for payment for capitalized interest 17 18 and costs incidental to issuance of the bonds. 19 SECTION 8. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 20peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
