

Senate Bill 5539

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

- Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Secretary of State for certain biennial expenses.
- Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Secretary of State.
- Limits certain biennial expenditures by Secretary of State from federal funds.
- Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the financial administration of the Secretary of State; appropriating money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Secretary of State, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the following purposes:

- (1) Administrative services \$ 2,022,493
- (2) Elections Division \$ 6,964,563
- (3) Archives Division \$ 1

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Secretary of State, for the following purposes:

- (1) Administrative services \$ 16,368,591
- (2) Elections Division \$ 128,052
- (3) Audits Division..... \$ 18,595,799
- (4) Archives Division \$ 8,381,814
- (5) Corporation Division \$ 8,242,406

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$7,740,353 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Secretary of State.

SECTION 4. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect July 1, 2013.
