## Senate Bill 563

Sponsored by Senator OLSEN

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Makes consumption of controlled substance on school property or at school function by person under 21 years of age unlawful. Punishes by maximum fine of \$1,000, or \$2,000 if violation committed while operating motor vehicle.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to unlawful consumption of controlled substances; and declaring an emergency.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 475.752 to 5 475.980.

6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) It is unlawful for any person under 21 years of age to knowingly or in-

tentionally consume a controlled substance on school property or at a school function unless
 the substance is consumed:

9 (a) In accordance with a valid prescription or order of a practitioner given in the course
 10 of professional practice; or

11 (b) As otherwise authorized by ORS 475.005 to 475.285 and 475.752 to 475.980 or by ORS 12 475.300 to 475.346.

(2) Unlawful consumption of a controlled substance by a person under 21 years of age is
 a Class B violation.

(3) Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, unlawful consumption of a controlled
substance by a person under 21 years of age is a Class A violation if the person violates
subsection (1) of this section while the person is operating a motor vehicle, as defined in ORS
801.360.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
 on its passage.
