

Senate Bill 563

Sponsored by Senator OLSEN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Makes consumption of controlled substance on school property or at school function by person under 21 years of age unlawful. Punishes by maximum fine of \$1,000, or \$2,000 if violation committed while operating motor vehicle.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to unlawful consumption of controlled substances; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 475.752 to**
5 **475.980.**

6 **SECTION 2. (1) It is unlawful for any person under 21 years of age to knowingly or in-**
7 **tentionally consume a controlled substance on school property or at a school function unless**
8 **the substance is consumed:**

9 (a) **In accordance with a valid prescription or order of a practitioner given in the course**
10 **of professional practice; or**

11 (b) **As otherwise authorized by ORS 475.005 to 475.285 and 475.752 to 475.980 or by ORS**
12 **475.300 to 475.346.**

13 (2) **Unlawful consumption of a controlled substance by a person under 21 years of age is**
14 **a Class B violation.**

15 (3) **Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, unlawful consumption of a controlled**
16 **substance by a person under 21 years of age is a Class A violation if the person violates**
17 **subsection (1) of this section while the person is operating a motor vehicle, as defined in ORS**
18 **801.360.**

19 **SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
20 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect**
21 **on its passage.**
