## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Bans use of motors on Waldo Lake.  
Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to Waldo Lake; amending ORS 830.180 and 830.185; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1.** ORS 830.180 is amended to read:

830.180. No person, other than the Department of State Police and governmental agencies of this state and the federal government having jurisdiction over the following described waters, shall use a motor for propelling a boat or for any purpose on the following named waters of this state located in the counties named:

 7 **SECTION 2.** ORS 830.185 is amended to read:

8 830.185. (1) No person shall operate a boat with an outboard or inboard motor at a speed in  
 9 excess of 10 miles per hour during those hours of the day and on those days of the year that it is  
 10 lawful to fish, on East Lake, Paulina Lake and Elk Lake in Deschutes County; Magone Lake in  
 11 Grant County; Timothy Lake in Clackamas County; and Davis Lake in Deschutes and Klamath  
 12 Counties.

13 (2) No person shall operate a boat with an outboard or inboard motor at a speed in excess of  
 14 10 miles per hour on the following named waters of this state located in the counties named:

 38 (3)(a) The State Marine Board shall establish an appropriate decibel rating and speed restriction  
 39 on Diamond Lake in Douglas County to allow recreational boating that is not limited to fishing.  
 40 Recreational boating does not include operating a jet ski or similar personal watercraft. The speed  
 41 established by the board:

- 42 (A) May not exceed 45 miles per hour between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m.;
- 43 (B) May not exceed 10 miles per hour between the hours of 6 p.m. and 9 a.m.; and
- 44 (C) Shall be restricted to 10 miles per hour at all times in any area within 200 yards of any boat  
 45 ramp, boat dock, swimming area, inlet or outlet of the lake, designated campground or summer

1 home.

2 (b) The board shall reduce the speed restriction on Diamond Lake to 10 miles per hour at all  
3 hours when the State Fish and Wildlife Director determines that the health of Diamond Lake is re-  
4 stored and the lake can be restocked for fishing.

5 **SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
6 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect**  
7 **on its passage.**
