

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 611

- 1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete “creating new provisions;” and delete “, 433.810”.
- 2 Delete lines 5 through 28 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:
- 3 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 339.867 is amended to read:
- 4 “339.867. As used in ORS 339.869 and 339.870, ‘medication’ means [*noninjectable*] medication **that**
- 5 **is not injected, except for premeasured doses of epinephrine that are injected.**
- 6 **“SECTION 2.** ORS 339.869 is amended to read:
- 7 “339.869. (1) The State Board of Education, in consultation with the Oregon Health Authority,
- 8 the Oregon State Board of Nursing and the State Board of Pharmacy, shall adopt:
- 9 **“(a)** Rules for the administration of prescription and nonprescription medication to students by
- 10 trained school personnel and for student self-medication. The rules shall include age appropriate
- 11 guidelines and training requirements for school personnel.
- 12 **“(b)** **Rules for the administration of premeasured doses of epinephrine by school person-**
- 13 **nel trained as provided by ORS 433.815 to any student or other individual on school premises**
- 14 **who the personnel believe in good faith is experiencing a severe allergic reaction, regardless**
- 15 **of whether the student or individual has a prescription for epinephrine.**
- 16 **“(c)** **Guidelines for the management of students with life-threatening food allergies, which**
- 17 **must include:**
- 18 **“(A)** **Standards for the education and training of school personnel to manage students**
- 19 **with life-threatening allergies.**
- 20 **“(B)** **Procedures for responding to life-threatening allergic reactions.**
- 21 **“(C)** **A process for the development of individualized health care and allergy plans for**
- 22 **every student with a known life-threatening allergy.**
- 23 **“(D)** **Protocols for preventing exposures to allergens.**
- 24 **“(2)(a)** School district boards shall adopt policies and procedures that provide for:
- 25 **“(A)** The administration of prescription and nonprescription medication to students by trained
- 26 school personnel [*and for*];
- 27 **“(B)** Student self-medication[.]; **and**
- 28 **“(C)** **The administration of premeasured doses of epinephrine to students and other indi-**
- 29 **viduals.**
- 30 **“(b)** [*Such*] Policies and procedures **adopted under paragraph (a) of this subsection** shall be
- 31 consistent with the rules adopted by the State Board of Education under subsection (1) of this sec-
- 32 tion. A school district board shall not require school personnel who have not received appropriate
- 33 training to administer medication.
- 34 **“SECTION 3.** ORS 433.825 is amended to read:
- 35 “433.825. (1)(a) A person who has successfully completed educational training described in ORS

1 433.815 for severe allergic responses may receive from any health care professional with appropriate
2 prescriptive privileges licensed under ORS chapter 677 or 678 in this state a prescription for pre-
3 measured doses of epinephrine and the necessary paraphernalia for administration.

4 **“(b) An entity that employs a person described in paragraph (a) of this subsection may**
5 **acquire premeasured doses of epinephrine and the necessary paraphernalia for adminis-**
6 **tration in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. A health care practitioner with**
7 **appropriate prescriptive privileges licensed under ORS chapter 677 or 678 may write a pre-**
8 **scription for premeasured doses of epinephrine and the necessary paraphernalia in the name**
9 **of an entity that employs a person described in paragraph (a) of this subsection.**

10 **“(c) [The] A person described in paragraph (a) of this subsection** may possess and
11 administer, in an emergency situation when a licensed health care professional is not immediately
12 available, [*such*] prescribed epinephrine to any person suffering a severe allergic response.

13 **“(2) A person who has successfully completed educational training in the administration of**
14 **glucagon as described in ORS 433.815 for hypoglycemia may receive from the parent or guardian**
15 **of a student doses of glucagon prescribed by a health care professional with appropriate prescriptive**
16 **privileges licensed under ORS chapter 677 or 678 in this state, as well as the necessary parapher-**
17 **nalialia for administration. The person may possess and administer glucagon to the student for whom**
18 **the glucagon is prescribed, if the student is suffering a severe hypoglycemic reaction in an emer-**
19 **gency situation when a licensed health care professional is not immediately available and other**
20 **treatment has failed or cannot be initiated.**

21 **“SECTION 4. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
22 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect**
23 **July 1, 2013.”.**

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
