## Senate Bill 639

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Authorizes employers to pay employees under 20 years of age hourly wage consistent with federal minimum wage for period of 90 days from date employee begins work.

2	Relating to youth employment.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 653.305 to
5	653.370.
6	SECTION 2. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 653.025, employers may pay employees under 20
7	years of age an hourly wage consistent with federal law related to the federal minimum
8	wage.
9	(2) Employers paying employees the hourly wage specified in subsection (1) of this sec-
10	tion:
11	(a) Must comply with all requirements for the employment of persons under 20 years of
12	age specified in this chapter; and
13	(b) May pay the specified wage to employees under 20 years of age for no more than 90
14	days from the date the employee begins work for the employer.
