Senate Bill 742

Sponsored by Senator EDWARDS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires person under 18 years of age to wear protective headgear while operating or riding on bicycle, riding on skateboard or scooter or using in-line skates or roller skates, on public or private land.

5	SECTION 1. ORS 814.485 is amended to read:
6	814.485. (1) As used in this section, "bicycle" has the meaning given in ORS 801.150 except
7	that:
8	(a) It also includes vehicles that meet the criteria specified in ORS 801.150 (1) to (4) but
9	that have wheels less than 14 inches in diameter.
10	(b) It does not include tricycles designed to be ridden by children.
11	(2) A person commits the offense of failure [of a bicycle operator or rider] to wear protective
12	headgear if the person is under $[16]$ 18 years of age, operates or rides on a bicycle [on a highway
13	or on premises open to the public] and is not wearing protective headgear of a type approved under
14	ORS 815.052.
15	[(2)] (3) Exemptions from this section are as provided in ORS 814.487.
16	[(3)] (4) The offense described in this section, failure [of a bicycle operator or rider] to wear
17	protective headgear, is a specific fine traffic violation. The presumptive fine for failure of a bicycle
18	operator or rider to wear protective headgear is \$25.
19	SECTION 2. ORS 814.486 is amended to read:
20	814.486. (1) As used in this section, "bicycle" has the meaning given in ORS 801.150 except
21	that:
22	(a) It also includes vehicles that meet the criteria specified in ORS 801.150 (1) to (4) but
23	that have wheels less than 14 inches in diameter.
24	(b) It does not include tricycles designed to be ridden by children.
25	(2) A person commits the offense of endangering a bicycle operator or passenger if:
26	(a) The person is operating a bicycle [on a highway or on premises open to the public] and the
27	person carries [another person] a child on the bicycle who is under [16] 18 years of age and is not
28	wearing protective headgear of a type approved under ORS 815.052; or
29	(b) The person is the parent, legal guardian or person with legal responsibility for the safety
30	and welfare of a child under $[16]$ 18 years of age and the child operates or rides on a bicycle [on a
31	highway or on premises open to the public] without wearing protective headgear of a type approved

2 [(2)] (3) Exemptions from this section are as provided in ORS 814.487.

3 [(3)] (4) The offense described in this section, endangering a bicycle operator or passenger, is 4 a specific fine traffic violation. The presumptive fine for endangering a bicycle operator or passenger 5 is \$25.

SECTION 3. ORS 814.600 is amended to read:

814.600. (1) A person commits the offense of failure of a skateboarder, scooter rider, [or] in-line
skater or roller skater to wear protective headgear if the person is under [16] 18 years of age, rides
on a skateboard or scooter or uses in-line skates or roller skates [on a highway or on premises open
to the public] and is not wearing protective headgear of a type approved under ORS 815.052.

(2) The offense described in this section, failure of a skateboarder, scooter rider, [or] in-line
skater or roller skater to wear protective headgear, is a specific fine traffic violation punishable
by a maximum fine of \$25. The presumptive fine for failure of a skateboarder, scooter rider, [or]
in-line skater or roller skater to wear protective headgear is \$25.

15 **SECTION 4.** ORS 814.487 is amended to read:

16 814.487. A person is exempt from the requirements under ORS 814.485 and 814.486 to wear pro17 tective headgear[,] if:

18 (1) Wearing the headgear would violate a religious belief or practice of the person[.]; or

19 (2) The person is operating or riding on a three-wheeled nonmotorized vehicle on a beach

20 while the beach is closed to motor vehicle traffic.

21 **SECTION 5.** ORS 814.488 is amended to read:

814.488. (1) If a child in violation of ORS 814.485 is 11 years of age or younger, any citation issued shall be issued to the parent, legal guardian or person with legal responsibility for the safety and welfare of the child for violation of ORS 814.486, rather than to the child for violation of ORS 814.485.

(2) If a child in violation of ORS 814.485 is at least 12 years of age and is under [16] 18 years
of age, a citation may be issued to the child for violation of ORS 814.485 or to the parent, legal
guardian or person with legal responsibility for the safety and welfare of the child for violation of
ORS 814.486, but not to both.

30 (3) The first time a person is convicted of an offense described in ORS 814.485 or 814.486, the 31 person shall not be required to pay a fine if the person proves to the satisfaction of the court that 32 the person has protective headgear of a type approved under ORS 815.052.

33 SECTION 6. ORS 815.052 is amended to read:

815.052. (1) As used in this section, "bicycle" has the meaning given in ORS 801.150 except
 that:

(a) It also includes vehicles that meet the criteria specified in ORS 801.150 (1) to (4) but
 that have wheels less than 14 inches in diameter.

(b) It does not include tricycles designed to be ridden by children.

(2) The Department of Transportation shall adopt and enforce rules establishing minimum standards and specifications for safe protective headgear to be worn by people operating bicycles, by passengers on bicycles and by people riding on skateboards or scooters or using in-line skates or roller skates. The rules shall conform, insofar as practicable, to national safety standards and specifications for such headgear.

44 **SECTION 7.** ORS 815.281 is amended to read:

45 815.281. (1) As used in this section, "bicycle" has the meaning given in ORS 801.150 except

1	that:
2	(a) It also includes vehicles that meet the criteria specified in ORS 801.150 (1) to (4) but
3	that have wheels less than 14 inches in diameter.
4	(b) It does not include tricycles designed to be ridden by children.
5	(2) A person commits the offense of selling noncomplying bicycle equipment if the person sells
6	or offers for sale any bicycle headgear that does not meet the standards established by the Depart-
7	ment of Transportation under ORS 815.052.
8	[(2)] (3) A person commits the offense of unlawfully renting or leasing a bicycle to another if the
9	person:
10	(a) Is in the business of renting or leasing bicycles; and
11	(b) Does not have bicycle headgear approved under ORS 815.052 available for rental for use by
12	persons under [16] 18 years of age.
13	(4) The offense described in subsection (3) of this section does not apply to a person
14	renting or leasing three-wheeled nonmotorized vehicles for use on a beach while the beach
15	is closed to motor vehicle traffic.
16	[(3)] (5) The offenses described in this section are Class D traffic violations.
