Whereas Michael McLaran had a lifelong passion for baseball, receiving a full baseball scholarship to the University of Oregon and coaching high school teams; and

Whereas Michael McLaran served with the Salem Hospital Foundation board of directors and with the Cascade Pacific Council, Boy Scouts of America; and

Whereas Michael McLaran earned numerous awards, including the Russell E. Pettit Memorial Excellence in Leadership Award and the Vern Miller Key Citizen Award; and
