Senate Joint Resolution 30

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to limit awards of noneconomic damages in medical liability actions to \$1 million.

Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

JOINT RESOLUTION 1 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon: 2 PARAGRAPH 1. The Constitution of the State of Oregon is amended by creating a new section 3 12 to be added to and made a part of Article XV, such section to read: 4 SECTION 12. (1) Noneconomic damages may not be recovered in a medical liability action 5 in an amount that exceeds \$1 million. 6 (2) For the purposes of this section: 7 (a) "Health care provider" means: 8 9 (A) A psychologist; (B) An occupational therapist; 10 (C) A physician; 11 12 (D) An emergency medical services provider; 13 (E) A podiatric physician and surgeon; (F) A nurse; 14 (G) A nurse practitioner; 15 (H) A dentist; 16 (I) A dental hygienist; 17 (J) A denturist; 18 (K) An audiologist or speech-language pathologist; 19 20 (L) An optometrist; 21 (M) A chiropractor; 22 (N) A naturopath; (O) A massage therapist; 23 24 (P) A physical therapist; (Q) A medical imaging licensee; 25 (R) A pharmacist; 26 27 (S) A physician assistant; (T) A direct entry midwife; 28

(U) An acupuncturist;

(V) A polysomnographic technologist;

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- 1 (W) A respiratory care practitioner; or
 - (X) A dietitian.
 - (b) "Medical liability action" means a civil action against a health care provider, hospital or other health care facility based on alleged negligence in providing health care.
 - (c) "Noneconomic damages" means subjective, nonmonetary losses, including but not limited to pain, mental suffering, emotional distress, humiliation, injury to reputation, loss of care, comfort, companionship and society, loss of consortium, inconvenience and interference with normal and usual activities apart from compensated employment.

<u>PARAGRAPH 2.</u> The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout this state.
