

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2163**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 29 and delete page  
2 2 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 461.200 is amended to read:

4 *“461.200. (1) [Within 105 days after the confirmation by the Senate of the*  
5 *Director of the Oregon State Lottery and at least three commissioners, the di-*  
6 *rector shall begin public sales of tickets or shares.] The Oregon State Lottery*  
7 *shall be initiated and shall continue to be operated so as to produce the*  
8 *maximum amount of net revenues to benefit the public purpose described in*  
9 *[section 4,] Article XV, **section 4**, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon,*  
10 *commensurate with the public good. **To achieve this end, in the imple-***  
11 ***mentation and operation of the Oregon State Lottery, the Oregon***  
12 ***State Lottery shall balance its mission to maximize revenues with its***  
13 ***mission to serve the public good through activities and choices that:***

14 ***“(a) Fairly and honestly inform users of lottery games of the po-***  
15 ***tential risk for abuse of lottery games; and***

16 ***“(b) Address and encourage responsible use of lottery games.***

17 ***“(2) A lottery game utilizing computer terminals or other devices:***

18 ***“(a) Shall sell, dispense or return tickets or shares; and***

19 ***“(b) May not dispense coins or currency directly to players.***

20 ***“(3) Other state government departments, boards, commissions, agencies***  
21 *and their officers shall cooperate with the **Oregon State** Lottery Commis-*  
22 *sion so as to aid the lottery commission in fulfilling these objectives.*

1       **“SECTION 2. Section 3 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part**  
2 **of ORS chapter 461.**

3       **“SECTION 3. (1) At the request of the Director of the Oregon State**  
4 **Lottery, the Oregon State Lottery Commission shall adopt a compre-**  
5 **hensive policy for implementation and operation of the Oregon State**  
6 **Lottery that ensures the integrity, security, honesty and fairness of**  
7 **the lottery games and the marketing practices and retail regulations**  
8 **of the games. The policy shall include:**

9       **“(a) A code of conduct for marketing and promoting the Oregon**  
10 **State Lottery that protects the public good by:**

11       **“(A) Ensuring integrity in marketing and promotional activities of**  
12 **the Oregon State Lottery;**

13       **“(B) Causing players of lottery games to be fairly and honestly in-**  
14 **formed about the potential risks associated with playing lottery**  
15 **games; and**

16       **“(C) Avoiding the use of marketing and promotional tactics or**  
17 **techniques that exploit vulnerable players of lottery games.**

18       **“(b) Strategies to ensure that lottery games, and the marketing and**  
19 **promotion of lottery games, are implemented:**

20       **“(A) Subject to awareness and analysis of the best available re-**  
21 **search into the effects of lottery games and marketing activities on**  
22 **vulnerable users of lottery games; and**

23       **“(B) Using methods designed to raise revenue and protect the public**  
24 **good.**

25       **“(c) Strategies to minimize the risk of harm to individuals whose**  
26 **struggles with mental health and addiction issues might be caused or**  
27 **affected by the marketing and promotion of lottery games.**

28       **“(2) The commission shall appoint committees, as the commission**  
29 **determines appropriate, to make recommendations and advise on the**  
30 **adoption of the comprehensive policy. A committee shall include indi-**

1 **viduals with expertise in responsible gambling programs and in mental**  
2 **health and addictions issues regarding gambling.**

3 **“(3) In cooperation with the Oregon Health Authority, the com-**  
4 **mission shall report annually to the appropriate session or interim**  
5 **human services committees of the Legislative Assembly:**

6 **“(a) Data collected regarding the use of computer terminals and**  
7 **devices utilized to deliver lottery games, including patterns of heavy**  
8 **or light usage of terminals and devices by location, time of day and**  
9 **seasonal periods; and**

10 **“(b) The efforts of the commission, consistent with the obligation**  
11 **to maximize the amount of net revenues commensurate with the**  
12 **public good, to utilize the usage data described in paragraph (a) of this**  
13 **subsection in policy and program decision-making to minimize the risk**  
14 **of harm for individuals.”.**
