

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3400**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 3, delete “291.216” and insert
2 “184.483”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 30 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 184.483 is amended to read:

5 “184.483. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall de-
6 velop and make available an Oregon transparency website. The website shall
7 allow any person to view information that is a public record and not exempt
8 from disclosure under ORS 192.410 to 192.505, including but not limited to
9 information described in subsection (3) of this section.

10 “(2) State agencies and education service districts, to the extent practi-
11 cable and subject to laws relating to confidentiality, when at no additional
12 cost, using existing data and existing resources of the state agency or edu-
13 cation service district and without reallocation of resources, shall:

14 “(a) Furnish information to the Oregon transparency website by posting
15 reports and providing links to existing information system applications in
16 accordance with standards established by the Oregon Department of Admin-
17 istrative Services; and

18 “(b) Provide the information in the format and manner required by the
19 Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

20 “(3) To the extent practicable and subject to laws relating to
21 confidentiality, when at no additional cost, using existing data and existing
22 resources of the state agency or education service district and without real-

1 location of resources, the Oregon transparency website shall contain infor-
2 mation about each state agency and education service district, including but
3 not limited to:

4 “(a) Annual revenues of state agencies and education service districts;

5 “(b) Annual expenditures of state agencies and education service districts;

6 “(c) Annual human resources expenses, including compensation, of state
7 agencies and education service districts;

8 “(d) Annual tax expenditures of state agencies, including, when possible,
9 the identity of the recipients of each tax expenditure;

10 “(e) Contracting and subcontracting information of state agencies and
11 education service districts, to the extent allowed by law, **including, for**
12 **each state agency, a description of the percentage of expenditures**
13 **made in this state and the percentage of expenditures made outside**
14 **this state under all contracts for goods or services entered into by the**
15 **state agency during each biennium;**

16 “(f) A prominently placed graphic representation of the primary funding
17 categories and approximate number of individuals served by the state agency
18 or the education service district;

19 “(g) A description of the mission, function and program categories of the
20 state agency or education service district;

21 “(h) Information about the state agency from the Oregon Progress Board;

22 “(i) A copy of any audit report issued by the Secretary of State for the
23 state agency or of any audit reports issued for the education service district;

24 “(j) The local service plans of the education service districts;

25 “(k) A copy of each report required by statute for education service dis-
26 tricts; and

27 “(L) A copy of all notices of public meetings of the education service
28 districts.

29 “(4) In addition to the information described in subsection (3) of this
30 section, each state agency shall post on the Oregon transparency website

1 notices of public meetings required to be provided by the state agency under
2 ORS 192.640.

3 “(5) In creating, operating, refining and recommending enhancements to
4 the Oregon transparency website, the Oregon Department of Administrative
5 Services and the Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission created in ORS
6 184.486 shall consider and, to the extent practicable, adhere to the following
7 principles:

8 “(a) The website must be accessible without cost and be easy to use;

9 “(b) Information included on the Oregon transparency website must be
10 presented using plain, easily understandable language; and

11 “(c) The website should teach users about how state government and ed-
12 ucation service districts work and provide users with the opportunity to
13 learn something about how state government and education service districts
14 raise and spend revenue.

15 “(6) If a state agency or an education service district is not able to in-
16 clude information described in this section on the Oregon transparency
17 website because of the lack of availability of information or cost in acquiring
18 it, the Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission created in ORS 184.486
19 shall list the information that is not included for that state agency or edu-
20 cation service district in the commission’s report to the Legislative Assembly
21 required under ORS 184.486.

22 **“SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 184.483 by section 1 of this**
23 **2013 Act apply to expenditures made under contracts for goods and**
24 **services entered into by state agencies during biennia beginning on or**
25 **after July 1, 2013.”.**

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
