

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 169**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, before the period insert “; and de-
2 claring an emergency”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 28 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. The Oregon Health Authority shall report in the
5 manner described in ORS 192.245 to the regular session of the Legis-
6 lative Assembly not later than February 1, 2015, the following:**

7 **“(1) The burden of diabetes in this state as measured by:**

8 **“(a) The estimated prevalence of diagnosed and undiagnosed adult
9 diabetes and, for diagnosed diabetes, the estimated prevalence by age,
10 race and sex;**

11 **“(b) The estimated prevalence of prediabetes and of diagnosed Type
12 I diabetes, Type II diabetes and gestational diabetes;**

13 **“(c) The number of hospitalizations and the estimated cost of
14 hospitalizations due to diabetes and due to heart disease in patients
15 diagnosed with diabetes;**

16 **“(d) The estimated costs of hospitalizations for diabetes compared
17 to hospitalizations for other common chronic diseases;**

18 **“(e) The National Quality Forum Measure 59, HbA1c Poor Control,
19 publicly reported for coordinated care organizations, including the
20 baseline measurements and all available quarterly data;**

21 **“(f) The estimated prevalence of obesity and overweight in the most
22 recent year for which data are readily available;**

1 “(g) The estimated direct and indirect costs of diabetes in the most
2 recent year for which data are readily available;

3 “(h) The estimated prevalence of diabetes among participants in
4 Medicaid-funded state programs;

5 “(i) The direct claims costs of diabetes to Medicaid-funded state
6 programs;

7 “(j) The estimated prevalence of diabetes among enrollees in health
8 benefit plans offered by the Public Employees’ Benefit Board;

9 “(k) The direct claims costs to the Public Employees’ Benefit Board
10 for treating diabetes and diabetes-related complications;

11 “(L) The estimated prevalence of diabetes among enrollees in health
12 benefit plans offered by the Oregon Educators Benefit Board; and

13 “(m) The direct claims costs to the Oregon Educators Benefit Board
14 for treating diabetes and diabetes-related complications.

15 “(2) The status of:

16 “(a) The strategic plan to start to slow the rate of diabetes caused
17 by obesity and other environmental factors by the year 2010 that was
18 developed in accordance with section 2, chapter 460, Oregon Laws 2007
19 (Enrolled House Bill 3486), including the authority’s current funding
20 recommendations to complete the implementation of the plan; and

21 “(b) Other strategies developed by the authority to reduce the im-
22 pact of prediabetes, diabetes and diabetes-related complications in-
23 cluding strategies to reduce hospitalizations and improve diabetes care
24 for participants in state-funded health programs.

25 “SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of
26 the convening of the 2016 regular session of the Legislative Assembly.

27 “SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate
28 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
29 declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.”.

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
