

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 436**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the  
2 rest of the line and insert “and declaring an emergency.”.

3 After line 2, insert:

4 “Whereas there is a strong, well-established link between health and  
5 learning; and

6 “Whereas a student’s health impacts the student’s school attendance, test  
7 scores and ability to pay attention in class; and

8 “Whereas emotional, oral and physical health problems can become bar-  
9 riers to learning, making it difficult for students to be academically or be-  
10 haviorally successful in school; and

11 “Whereas higher levels of education are associated with longer life and  
12 an increased likelihood of obtaining or understanding basic health informa-  
13 tion and services needed to make appropriate health decisions; and

14 “Whereas less education predicts higher levels of health risks, such as  
15 obesity, substance abuse and violence; and

16 “Whereas appropriate integration of systems and programs of health and  
17 education will benefit community health and educational achievement; now,  
18 therefore,”.

19 Delete lines 4 through 31 and delete pages 2 through 4 and insert:

20 “**SECTION 1. (1) A community health improvement plan adopted**  
21 **by a coordinated care organization and its community advisory council**  
22 **in accordance with section 13, chapter 8, Oregon Laws 2012, shall in-**

1 **clude, to the extent practicable, a strategy and a plan for:**

2 **“(a) Working with the Early Learning Council, the Youth Develop-**  
3 **ment Council and the school health providers in the region; and**

4 **“(b) Coordinating the effective and efficient delivery of health care**  
5 **to children and adolescents in the community.**

6 **“(2) A community health improvement plan must be based on re-**  
7 **search, including research into adverse childhood experiences, and**  
8 **must identify funding sources and additional funding necessary to ad-**  
9 **dress the health needs of children and adolescents in the community**  
10 **and to meet the goals of the plan. The plan must also:**

11 **“(a) Evaluate the adequacy of the existing school-based health**  
12 **center network to meet the specific pediatric and adolescent health**  
13 **care needs in the community;**

14 **“(b) Make recommendations to improve the school-based health**  
15 **center system, including the addition or improvement of electronic**  
16 **medical records and billing systems;**

17 **“(c) Take into consideration whether integration of school-based**  
18 **health centers with the larger health system or system of community**  
19 **clinics would further advance the goals of the plan;**

20 **“(d) Improve the integration of all services provided to meet the**  
21 **needs of children, adolescents and families;**

22 **“(e) Focus on primary care, behavioral health and oral health; and**

23 **“(f) Address promotion of health and prevention and early inter-**  
24 **vention in the treatment of children and adolescents.**

25 **“(3) A coordinated care organization shall involve in the develop-**  
26 **ment of its community health improvement plan, school-based health**  
27 **centers, school nurses, school mental health providers and individuals**  
28 **representing:**

29 **“(a) The Early Learning Council;**

30 **“(b) The Youth Development Council in the region;**

1       “(c) The Healthy Start Family Support Services program in the re-  
2       gion;

3       “(d) The Health Care for All Oregon Children program and other  
4       medical assistance programs;

5       “(e) Relief nurseries in the region;

6       “(f) Community health centers;

7       “(g) Oral health care providers;

8       “(h) Community mental health providers;

9       “(i) Administrators of county health department programs that of-  
10      fer preventive health services to children;

11      “(j) Hospitals in the region; and

12      “(k) Other appropriate child and adolescent health program ad-  
13      ministrators.

14      “(4) The Oregon Health Authority may provide incentive grants to  
15      coordinated care organizations for the purpose of contracting with  
16      individuals or organizations to help coordinate integration strategies  
17      identified in the community health improvement plan adopted by the  
18      community advisory council. The authority may also provide funds to  
19      coordinated care organizations to improve systems of services that will  
20      promote the implementation of the plan.

21      “(5) Each coordinated care organization shall report to the author-  
22      ity, in the form and manner prescribed by the authority, on the  
23      progress of the integration strategies and implementation of the plan  
24      for working with the Early Learning Council, the Youth Development  
25      Council and school health care providers in the region, as part of the  
26      development and implementation of the community health improve-  
27      ment plan. The authority shall compile the information and report the  
28      information to the Legislative Assembly by December 31, 2014.

29      “SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of  
30      the convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly

1 as specified in ORS 171.010.

2 **SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate**  
3 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**  
4 **declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
