## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 800

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 30 and delete <u>page</u> 2 <u>2</u> and insert:

3 "<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section:

4 "(a) 'Local government' has the meaning given that term in ORS
5 174.116.

6 "(b) 'Pesticide', public applicator' and 'public trainee' have the 7 meanings given those terms in ORS 634.006.

"(2) The Task Force on Pesticide Application Reporting is established, consisting of seven members appointed by the Governor.

"(3) The task force shall study and develop recommendations re-10 garding whether state and local governments should be required to 11 report pesticide applications by public applicators or public trainees. 12If the task force recommends that reporting be required, the task 13 force shall also make recommendations regarding what information 14 should be reported, how a reporting system should be structured and 15administered and how the reported information should be used and 16 made available. 17

18 "(4) The task force may take testimony, review the structure and 19 features of existing record keeping and reporting systems, review state 20 agency records regarding pesticide applications to public lands, review 21 environmental data and take any other reasonable actions to allow the 22 task force to carry out its work. 1 "(5) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a 2 quorum for the transaction of business.

"(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a
majority of the members of the task force.

5 "(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as 6 chairperson.

"(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make
an appointment to become immediately effective.

9 "(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the 10 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task 11 force.

"(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation
 of the task force.

"(11) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations
 to the Governor and to an interim committee of the Legislative As sembly dealing with agriculture in the manner provided by ORS 192.245
 no later than October 1, 2014.

"(12) The State Department of Agriculture shall provide staff sup port to the task force.

"(13) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the State Department of Agriculture for purposes of the task force.

"(14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties. "SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of
 the convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly
 as specified in ORS 171.010.

"<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
