

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2392**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 3, before the period insert “; and de-  
2 claring an emergency”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 30 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** Section 21, chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to  
5 read:

6 **“Sec. 21.** (1) The Youth Development Council is established. The council  
7 shall function under the direction and control of the Oregon Education In-  
8 vestment Board established by section 1, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011.

9 “(2) The council is established for the purpose of assisting the board in  
10 overseeing a unified system that provides services to school-age children  
11 through youth 20 years of age in a manner that supports academic success,  
12 reduces criminal involvement and is integrated, measurable and accountable.

13 “(3) The council consists of no fewer than 15 members who are appointed  
14 by the Governor. The Governor shall ensure that membership of the council  
15 satisfies any federal requirements for membership of a state advisory com-  
16 mittee on juvenile justice[,] and shall include **a minimum of three repre-**  
17 **sentatives of county departments and boards of county commissioners**  
18 **from diverse regions of this state and** tribal representation in the mem-  
19 bership of the council. **When determining whom to appoint to the**  
20 **council, the Governor shall ensure that each congressional district of**  
21 **this state is represented by at least one member of the council.**

22 “(4) The council shall:

1        *“(a) Prioritize funding for prevention and intervention services related to*  
2 *gang violence and gang involvement.]*

3        **“(a) Determine the availability of funding to support community-**  
4 **based youth development programs, services and initiatives with**  
5 **demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives established by the**  
6 **council by rule. Funding available under ORS 417.855 may not be in-**  
7 **cluded in the determination of availability of funding under this par-**  
8 **agraph.**

11 **to juvenile delinquency and the promotion of protective factors that**  
12 **increase the health and well-being of children and youth, as supported**  
13 **by evidence-based program models and other research-based models;**

15        **“(B) The prevention of and intervention in gang violence and gang**  
16 **involvement.**

17        **“(c) Using youth population data, establish an equitable formula for**  
18 **the distribution of funding identified in paragraph (a) of this sub-**  
19 **section to programs and services in all geographic areas of this state.**

20        **“(d) As determined to be necessary or appropriate, enter into**  
21 **performance-based intergovernmental agreements with regional and**  
22 **county entities, and tribal governments, to contract for the provision**  
23 **of youth development programs, services and initiatives that will**  
24 **achieve demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives established**  
25 **by the council by rule.**

26        *“(b) (e) Determine the means by which services to children and youth*  
27 *may be provided effectively and efficiently across multiple programs to im-*  
28 *prove the academic and social outcomes of children and youth.*

29        *“(c) (f) Assess state programs and services related to youth development*  
30 *and training, and identify methods by which programs and services may be*

1 coordinated or consolidated.

2 “[*d*] (g) Establish common academic and social indicators to support  
3 attainment of goals established by the Oregon Education Investment Board.

4 “[*e*] (h) Establish common program outcome measurements and coordi-  
5 nate data collection across multiple programs and services.

6 “[*f*] (i) Ensure implementation of best practices that:

7 “(A) Are evidence based;

8 “(B) Are culturally, gender and age appropriate;

9 “(C) Address individual risk factors;

10 “(D) Build upon **protective** factors that increase the health and well-  
11 being of children and youth; [*and*]

12 “(E) **Respond to local concerns and considerations that are brought**  
13 **to the attention of the council or that are identified and reported to**  
14 **the council by members of the council who are representatives of**  
15 **county departments and boards of county commissioners; and**

16 “[*E*] (F) Include tribal best practices.

17 “(5) **Notwithstanding subsection (4)(c) of this section, funding pri-**  
18 **oritized for the prevention of and intervention in gang violence and**  
19 **gang involvement shall be directed by the council, through a compet-**  
20 **itive selection process, to geographic areas of this state with demon-**  
21 **strated need.**

22 “(6) **Notwithstanding subsection (4)(c) of this section, the council,**  
23 **through a competitive selection process, may direct funding deter-**  
24 **mined to be available for community-based youth development pro-**

4 **areas of this state, demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives**  
5 **established by the council by rule.**

6 “[5] (7) The Governor may designate one member of the council to serve  
7 as the chairperson or, if the Governor chooses not to designate a chair-  
8 person, the council may elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

9 **“(8) The council shall, in consultation with the Oregon Education**  
10 **Investment Board, adopt rules to implement the provisions of this**  
11 **section. Rules adopted by the council must, at a minimum, establish**  
12 **demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives for community-based**  
13 **youth development programs, services and initiatives that receive**  
14 **funding pursuant to this section.**

15 **“(9) As used in this section, ‘county department’ means an office**  
16 **designated by the county governing body as defined in ORS 357.216 to**  
17 **perform specific duties and functions.**

14 “[6] *In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the*  
15 *council may adopt rules necessary for the administration of the laws that the*  
16 *council is charged with administering.]*

17 **“(8) The council shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of**  
18 **this section. Rules adopted by the council must, at a minimum, es-**  
19 **tablish demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives for**  
20 **community-based youth development programs, services and initi-**  
21 **atives that receive funding pursuant to this section.**

22 **“(9) As used in this section, ‘county department’ means an office**  
23 **designated by the county governing body as defined in ORS 357.216 to**  
24 **perform specific duties and functions.**

25 **“SECTION 3.** Section 26, chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to  
26 read:

27 **“Sec. 26.** By November 1, 2013, the Youth Development Council shall  
28 submit a report to the Oregon Education Investment Board that establishes  
29 funding priorities for [*gang violence intervention efforts and programs that*  
30 *assist gang-affected youth.*]:

1       **“(1) The prevention of and intervention in the risk factors that lead**  
2 **to juvenile delinquency, including funding priorities for community-**  
3 **based youth development programs, services and initiatives with**  
4 **demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives; and**

5       **“(2) Gang violence prevention and intervention efforts and services**  
6 **that assist gang-involved youth.**

7       **“SECTION 4. (1) The equitable formula for the distribution of**  
8 **funding identified in section 21 (4)(a), chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012,**  
9 **as amended by section 1 of this 2013 Act, must be established no later**  
10 **than June 30, 2013.**

11       **“(2) The Youth Development Council shall enter into performance-**  
12 **based intergovernmental agreements with regional and county enti-**  
13 **ties, and tribal governments, as required by section 21 (4)(d), chapter**  
14 **37, Oregon Laws 2012, as amended by section 1 of this 2013 Act, by**  
15 **September 1, 2013. The youth development programs, services and ini-**  
16 **tiatives that are to be provided pursuant to such agreements under**  
17 **section 21 (4)(d), chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, as amended by section**  
18 **1 of this 2013 Act, must be provided by September 30, 2013.**

19       **“SECTION 5. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate**  
20 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**  
21 **declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
