## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2928

- On page 4 of the printed bill, delete lines 3 through 38 and insert:
- **"SECTION 3.** ORS 453.035 is amended to read:
- "453.035. (1) The Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall adopt
  standards for the labeling of hazardous substances and for the labeling of
- 5 articles that contain hazardous substances.

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- "(2)(a) Before requiring labeling of a hazardous substance or an article that contains a hazardous substance under this section, the Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall contact the Department of Consumer and Business Services to determine whether the department requires the labeling of the hazardous substance or article pursuant to ORS chapter 654.
- "(b) If the department requires the labeling of the hazardous substance or article, the Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall require the hazardous substance or article to be labeled in accordance with the department's requirements.
- "(c) If the department does not require the labeling of the hazardous substance or article, the Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall adopt standards for the labeling of the hazardous substance or article as provided in this section.
- "(3) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the Director of the Oregon Health Authority may [permit or] require the use of a recognized generic name, [or may require] the common or usual name or, [the

- 1 chemical name,] if there is no common or usual name, the chemical name
- 2 of the hazardous substance or of each component [which] that the director
- 3 finds contributes substantially to its hazard.
- 4 "[(2)] (4) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the di-
- 5 rector shall require:
- 6 "(a) The word 'Danger' on substances [which], or on articles containing
- 7 **substances, that** are extremely flammable, corrosive or highly toxic;
- 8 "(b) The word 'Warning' or 'Caution' on other hazardous substances or
- 9 on other articles containing hazardous substances;
- "(c) An affirmative statement of the principal hazard or hazards, such as
- 'Flammable,' 'Combustible,' 'Vapor Harmful,' 'Causes Burns,' 'Absorbed
- 12 Through Skin,' or similar wording descriptive of the hazard;
- "(d) Precautionary measures describing the action to be followed or
- avoided, except when modified by rule of the director pursuant to subsection
- 15 [(4)] (6) of this section;
- "(e) Instruction, when necessary or appropriate, for first-aid treatment;
- "(f) The word 'Poison' for any hazardous substance [which], or for any
- 18 article containing any hazardous substance, that is defined as 'highly
- 19 toxic' in ORS 453.005;
- 20 "(g) Instructions for handling and storage of packages [which] that re-
- 21 quire special care in handling or storage;
- 22 "(h) Adequate directions for the protection of children from the hazard
- 23 if the article is intended for use by children and is not a banned hazardous
- substance, or the statement 'Keep out of the reach of children,' or its prac-
- 25 tical equivalent, if the article is not intended for use by children; and
- 26 "(i) The name and place of business of the manufacturer, packer, distrib-
- 27 utor or seller.
- 28 "[(3)] (5) Any statement required by subsection (4) of this section must
- 29 be in the English language, located prominently and in conspicuous and
- 30 legible type in contrast by typography, layout or color with other printed

1 matter on the label.

"[(4)] (6) If the director finds that, because of the size of the package in-2 volved or because of the minor hazard presented by the substance contained 3 [therein] in the package, or for other good and sufficient reasons, full 4 compliance with the labeling requirements otherwise applicable under ORS 5 453.005 to 453.135 and 453.990 (2) is impracticable or is not necessary for the 6 adequate protection of the public health and safety, the director may [au-7 thorize the exemption of exempt such substance, or article containing 8 such substance, from the requirements[, to an extent consistent with] of 9 subsection (4) of this section to the extent that the exemption still 10 provides adequate protection of the public health and safety.". 11

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
