

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3403**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “buildings” delete the rest of
2 the line and line 3 and insert “; and declaring an emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 31 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Healthy Vending Task Force is established,**
5 **consisting of 15 members appointed as follows:**

6 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from**
7 **among members of the Senate.**

8 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one**
9 **member from among members of the House of Representatives.**

10 **“(c) The Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall appoint the**
11 **following 13 members:**

12 **“(A) One member who represents the Oregon Health Authority**
13 **Public Health Division;**

14 **“(B) One member who represents the Commission for the Blind;**

15 **“(C) One member who represents the Commission for the Blind**
16 **Business Enterprise Program;**

17 **“(D) One member who represents the Commission for the Blind**
18 **Business Enterprise Consumer Committee of Oregon;**

19 **“(E) One member who represents the vending machine industry;**

20 **“(F) One member who represents the Public Employees’ Benefit**
21 **Board;**

22 **“(G) One member who represents labor organizations that represent**

1 **public employees;**

2 **“(H) One member who represents the Oregon Department of Ad-**
3 **ministrative Services;**

4 **“(I) One member who represents the office of the Governor;**

5 **“(J) One member who represents public health advocacy organiza-**
6 **tions;**

7 **“(K) One member who represents the interests of local governments**
8 **as those interests relate to healthy food and beverage vending machine**
9 **programs in public buildings;**

10 **“(L) One member who is a registered dietitian; and**

11 **“(M) One member of the public.**

12 **“(2) The task force shall:**

13 **“(a) Explore current local and state initiatives to promote and**
14 **evaluate government-based, work site nutrition initiatives, including**
15 **work led by the Public Employees’ Benefit Board;**

16 **“(b) Review evidence-based research on the nutritional standards**
17 **for current programs for offering healthy food and beverage vending**
18 **machine programs in public buildings;**

19 **“(c) Study the current practices and economics of food and beverage**
20 **vending machine programs in public buildings;**

21 **“(d) Review studies from previous efforts by the Commission for the**
22 **Blind Business Enterprise Program and by state and local jurisdictions**
23 **that have passed healthy vending machine regulations to learn about**
24 **the challenges to, barriers to and successes in implementing healthy**
25 **food and beverage vending machine programs in public buildings;**

26 **“(e) Explore strategies for increasing the sales of healthy food and**
27 **beverages in vending machines that may include, but not be limited**
28 **to, gathering public employee input, developing marketing and pro-**
29 **motional materials, developing appropriate pricing for products and**
30 **researching strategic placement of products in vending machines;**

1 “(f) Explore the training and technical assistance that may be nec-
2 essary to support Commission for the Blind Business Enterprise Pro-
3 gram vendors and local and state government agencies in transitioning
4 to offering healthy food and beverage vending machine programs in
5 public buildings; and

6 “(g) Research funding strategies and identify sources of funding to
7 provide training, transitional support, marketing and promotional
8 support, subsidies and incentives to assist in the implementation of
9 pilot programs or full-scale programs for offering healthy food and
10 beverage vending machine programs in public buildings.

11 “(3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a
12 quorum for the transaction of business.

13 “(4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a
14 majority of the members of the task force.

15 “(5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as
16 chairperson.

17 “(6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority
18 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

19 “(7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
20 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task
21 force.

22 “(8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of
23 the task force.

24 “(9) The task force shall submit to the Legislative Assembly, in the
25 manner provided by ORS 192.245, a progress report that may include
26 recommendations for legislation, no later than December 15, 2013. The
27 task force shall submit to the Legislative Assembly, no later than
28 September 1, 2014, a final report that may include recommendations
29 on issues including, but not limited to, nutrition standards for food
30 and beverages offered in vending machines in public buildings, con-

1 tract stipulations for vending machine programs and opportunities for
2 the use of funds from the Public Employees' Benefit Board and other
3 sources to support healthy food and beverage vending machine pro-
4 grams in public buildings.

5 “(10) The Oregon Health Authority shall provide staff support to the
6 task force.

7 “(11) Members of the task force who are not members of the Leg-
8 islative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reim-
9 bursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by
10 them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and
11 amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in
12 performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds ap-
13 propriated to the authority for purposes of the task force.

14 “(12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,
15 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties
16 and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to
17 furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force
18 consider necessary to perform their duties.

19 “SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of
20 the convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly
21 as specified in ORS 171.010.

22 “SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate
23 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
24 declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.”.

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
