

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 572**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete the period and insert “; and  
2 prescribing an effective date.”.

3 In line 4, after “ORS” delete the rest of the line and delete lines 5 through  
4 30 and delete page 2 and insert “654.001 to 654.295.

5 **“SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:**

6 **“(a) ‘Claim’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 656.005.**

7 **“(b) ‘Disabling compensable injury’ has the meaning given that  
8 term in ORS 656.005.**

9 **“(c) ‘Hospital’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 442.015.**

10 **“(2) A hospital must have a written safe patient handling policy  
11 that is made available to all hospital staff who provide direct patient  
12 care. The policy must prescribe the procedures for the safe lifting,  
13 transferring and repositioning of patients, including the appropriate  
14 use of lift equipment and other assistive devices.**

15 **“(3) The safety committee, as described in ORS 654.182, of each  
16 hospital shall annually:**

17 **“(a) Obtain from the Department of Consumer and Business Ser-  
18 vices the rate of claims for disabling compensable injuries for the  
19 hospital and the aggregate rate for all hospitals in this state;**

20 **“(b) Review the claims information for the disabling compensable  
21 injuries caused by lifting, transferring or repositioning patients and  
22 make recommendations to the governing body of the hospital for ways**

1 to prevent disabling compensable injuries similar to the injuries for  
2 which claims were filed;

3 “(c) Review the rate of claims for disabling compensable claims for  
4 the hospital in comparison to the aggregate rate for all hospitals in  
5 this state to determine if the safe patient handling policy described in  
6 subsection (2) of this section has reduced claims for disabling  
7 compensable injuries; and

8 “(d) Recommend changes to the safe patient handling policy to  
9 further reduce the number of injuries due to disabling compensable  
10 injuries.

11 “SECTION 3. This 2013 Act takes effect February 1, 2015.”.

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
