

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 850**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “offenses” insert “; creating new pro-
2 visions; and amending ORS 811.111”.

3 After line 23, insert:

4 **“SECTION 3.** ORS 811.111 is amended to read:

5 “811.111. (1) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the
6 person:

7 “(a) Drives a vehicle on an interstate highway at a speed greater than
8 [65] **70** miles per hour or, if a different speed is posted under ORS 810.180 (3),
9 at a speed greater than the posted speed.

10 “(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, drives any of the
11 following vehicles at a speed greater than [55] **60** miles per hour on [any]
12 **an interstate** highway or, if a different speed is posted under ORS 810.180
13 (3), at a speed greater than the posted speed:

14 “(A) A motor truck with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000
15 pounds or a truck tractor with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than
16 8,000 pounds.

17 “(B) A school bus.

18 “(C) A school activity vehicle.

19 “(D) A worker transport bus.

20 “(E) A bus operated for transporting children to and from church or an
21 activity or function authorized by a church.

22 “(F) Any vehicle used in the transportation of persons for hire by a

1 nonprofit entity as provided in ORS 825.017 (9).

2 “(c) Drives a vehicle or conveyance on any part of the ocean shore in this
3 state at a speed greater than any of the following:

4 “(A) Any designated speed for ocean shores that is established and posted
5 under ORS 810.180.

6 “(B) If no designated speed is posted under ORS 810.180, 25 miles per
7 hour.

8 “(d) Drives a vehicle upon a highway in any city at a speed greater than
9 a speed posted by authority granted under ORS 810.180 or, if no speed is
10 posted, the following:

11 “(A) Fifteen miles per hour when driving on an alley or a narrow resi-
12 dential roadway.

13 “(B) Twenty miles per hour in a business district.

14 “(C) Twenty-five miles per hour in a public park.

15 “(D) Twenty-five miles per hour on a highway in a residence district if
16 the highway is not an arterial highway.

17 “(E) [*Sixty-five*] **Seventy** miles per hour on an interstate highway.

18 “(F) Fifty-five miles per hour in locations not otherwise described in this
19 paragraph.

20 “(e) Drives a vehicle in a school zone at a speed greater than 20 miles
21 per hour if the school zone is:

22 “(A) A segment of highway described in ORS 801.462 (1)(a) and:

23 “(i) The school zone has a flashing light used as a traffic control device
24 and operated under ORS 810.243 and the flashing light indicates that chil-
25 dren may be arriving at or leaving school; or

26 “(ii) If the school zone does not have a flashing light used as a traffic
27 control device, the person drives in the school zone between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.
28 on a day when school is in session.

29 “(B) A crosswalk described in ORS 801.462 (1)(b) and:

30 “(i) A flashing light used as a traffic control device and operated under

1 ORS 810.243 indicates that children may be arriving at or leaving school; or

2 “(ii) Children are present, as described in ORS 811.124.

3 “(2) The offense described in this section, violating a speed limit, is
4 punishable as provided in ORS 811.109.

5 **“SECTION 4. The amendments to ORS 811.111 by section 3 of this
6 2013 Act apply to offenses committed on or after the effective date of
7 this 2013 Act.”.**
