

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2163**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 11 and 12 and insert “to gen-  
2 erate revenues while placing high priority on protecting Oregonians from  
3 unintended negative consequences associated with practices and products of  
4 the Oregon State Lottery.”.

5 Delete lines 25 through 29.

6 On page 2, delete lines 1 through 3 and insert:

7 “(a) A code of conduct for marketing and promotion of Oregon State  
8 Lottery games;

9 “(b) Strategies to enhance the personal responsibility of persons who play  
10 lottery games;

11 “(c) Strategies for product development and retailer training to reduce the  
12 risk of excessive playing of lottery games;

13 “(d) Institutional structures in support of efforts to protect Oregonians  
14 from unintended negative consequences associated with products of the  
15 Oregon State Lottery and the marketing and promotion of lottery games;”.

16 Delete lines 9 and 10 and insert “with expertise in responsible gambling  
17 programs and practices to advise the commission regarding:”.

18 In line 16, delete “report” and insert “submit”.

19 Delete lines 18 through 31 and insert “Assembly a report that:

20 “(a) Describes the efforts of the commission to minimize the risks and  
21 mitigate the harms associated with lottery products and the marketing and  
22 promotion of lottery games;

1       “(b) Describes and assesses the collaboration between the Oregon State  
2 Lottery and the Oregon Health Authority in fulfilling their respective roles  
3 in mitigating gambling-related harm; and

4       “(c) Describes and analyzes player data and sales data for lottery games  
5 related to identifying and addressing geographic locations and players, or  
6 groups of players, perceived to have a high risk due to excessive lottery game  
7 play.

8       “(4) The director shall provide adequate resources and staffing to:

9       “(a) Coordinate, evaluate and report on the efforts of the Oregon State  
10 Lottery to provide gambling services in a way that minimizes to customers  
11 and the community the harm associated with products and activities of the  
12 Oregon State Lottery; and

13       “(b) Advise the director and the commission.”.
