

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 146**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 31 and delete pages
2 2 and 3 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 248.008 is amended to read:

4 “248.008. (1) An affiliation of electors becomes a minor political party in
5 the state, a county or other electoral district, qualified to make nominations
6 for public office in that electoral district and in any other electoral district
7 wholly contained within the electoral district, when [*either of the following*
8 *events occurs*] **the affiliation of electors has acted as described in either**
9 **paragraph (a) or (b) of this subsection:**

10 “(a)(A) When the affiliation of electors has filed with the Secretary of
11 State a petition with the signatures of at least a number of electors equal
12 to one and one-half percent of the total votes cast in the electoral district
13 for all candidates for Governor at the most recent election at which a can-
14 didate for Governor was elected to a full term.

15 **“(B) The petition must contain only original signatures and must**
16 **be filed not later than two years following the date the prospective**
17 **petition is filed.** The petition [*also*] must state the intention to form a new
18 political party and [*give the designation of it*] **designate a name for the**
19 **political party.** [*The petition must contain only original signatures and must*
20 *be filed not later than two years following the date the prospective petition is*
21 *filed.*]

22 **“(C) Before circulating the petition, the chief sponsor of the petition**

1 **must file with the Secretary of State a signed copy of the prospective**
2 **petition. The chief sponsor must include with the prospective petition**
3 **a statement declaring whether one or more persons will be paid money**
4 **or other valuable consideration for obtaining signatures of electors on**
5 **the petition. After the prospective petition is filed, the chief sponsor**
6 **must notify the filing officer not later than the 10th day after the chief**
7 **sponsor first has knowledge or should have had knowledge that:**

8 **“(i) Any person is being paid for obtaining signatures, when the**
9 **statement included with the prospective petition declared that no**
10 **person would be paid for obtaining signatures of electors.**

11 **“(ii) No person is being paid for obtaining signatures, when the**
12 **statement included with the prospective petition declared that one or**
13 **more persons would be paid for obtaining signatures of electors.**

14 **“(D) The circulator shall certify on each signature sheet that the**
15 **circulator witnessed the signing of the signature sheet by each individual**
16 **whose signature appears on the signature sheet and that the circulator be-**
17 **lieves each individual is an elector registered in the electoral district.**

18 **“(E) The Secretary of State shall verify whether the petition contains the**
19 **required number of signatures of electors. The Secretary of State may not**
20 **accept a petition for filing if it contains less than 100 percent of the required**
21 **number of signatures. The Secretary of State by rule shall designate a sta-**
22 **tistical sampling technique to verify whether a petition contains the required**
23 **number of signatures of electors. A petition may not be rejected for the**
24 **reason that it contains less than the required number of signatures unless**
25 **two separate sampling processes both establish that the petition lacks the**
26 **required number of signatures. The second sampling must contain a larger**
27 **number of signatures than the first sampling. The Secretary of State may**
28 **employ professional assistance to determine the sampling technique. The**
29 **statistical sampling technique may be the same as that adopted under ORS**
30 **250.105. [*Before circulating the petition, the chief sponsor of the petition must***

1 *file with the Secretary of State a signed copy of the prospective petition. The*
2 *chief sponsor must include with the prospective petition a statement declaring*
3 *whether one or more persons will be paid money or other valuable consider-*
4 *ation for obtaining signatures of electors on the petition. After the prospective*
5 *petition is filed, the chief sponsor must notify the filing officer not later than*
6 *the 10th day after the chief sponsor first has knowledge or should have had*
7 *knowledge that:]*

8 *“(A) Any person is being paid for obtaining signatures, when the statement*
9 *included with the prospective petition declared that no such person would be*
10 *paid.]*

11 *“(B) No person is being paid for obtaining signatures, when the statement*
12 *included with the prospective petition declared that one or more such persons*
13 *would be paid.]*

14 “(b) When the affiliation of electors has polled for any one of its candi-
15 dates for any public office in the electoral district at least one percent of the
16 total votes cast in the electoral district for all candidates for:

17 “(A) Presidential elector at the last general election at which candidates
18 for President and Vice President of the United States were listed on the
19 ballot; or

20 “(B) Any single state office to be voted upon in the state at large for
21 which nominations by political parties are permitted by law at the most re-
22 cent election at which a candidate for the office was elected to a full term.

23 “(2) After satisfying either [*requirement of*] subsection (1)(a) or (b) of this
24 section, the minor political party may nominate candidates for election at
25 the next general election.

26 “(3) A filing officer may not accept a certificate of nomination of a can-
27 didate nominated by a minor political party for a subsequent general election
28 unless the minor political party has [*satisfied the requirements of subsection*
29 *(4)(a) or (b) of this section*] **maintained status as a minor political party**
30 **as described in subsection (4) of this section.**

1 “(4) [After a minor political party qualifies to nominate candidates for a
2 general election under subsection (1) of this section,] In order to maintain
3 status as a minor political party for a subsequent general election:

4 “[(a)(A) Following each general election, at any time during the period be-
5 ginning on the date of the next primary election and ending on the 90th day
6 before the next general election, a number of electors equal to at least one-tenth
7 of one percent of the total votes cast in the state or electoral district for all
8 candidates for Governor at the most recent election at which a candidate for
9 Governor was elected to a full term must be registered as members of the party;
10 and]

11 “[(B) A candidate or candidates of the party must poll a number of votes
12 described in subsection (1)(b) of this section at each subsequent general
13 election; or]

14 “[(b)(a) Following each general election, at any time during the period
15 beginning on the date of the next primary election and ending on the 90th
16 day before the next general election, a number of electors equal to at least
17 one-half of one percent of the total number of registered electors in this state
18 must be registered as members of the party[.]; or

19 **“(b)(A) Following each general election, at any time during the pe-
20 riod beginning on the date of the next primary election and ending on
21 the 90th day before the next general election, a number of electors
22 equal to at least one-tenth of one percent of the total votes cast in the
23 state or electoral district for all candidates for Governor at the most
24 recent election at which a candidate for Governor was elected to a full
25 term must be registered as members of the party; and**

26 **“(B) At least once in a four-year period, a candidate or candidates
27 of the party must poll at least one percent of the total votes cast in
28 the electoral district for all candidates for:**

29 **“(i) Presidential elector at the last general election at which can-
30 didates for President and Vice President of the United States were**

1 **listed on the ballot; or**

2 **“(ii) Any single state office to be voted upon in the state at large**
3 **for which nominations by political parties are permitted by law at the**
4 **most recent election at which a candidate for the office was elected**
5 **to a full term.**

6 “(5) An affiliation of electors that fails to maintain [*its*] status as a minor
7 political party[, *as described in subsection (4) of this section,*] ceases to be a
8 minor political party on the 90th day before the date of the next general
9 election.

10 “(6) During the period beginning on the date of the primary election and
11 ending on the 90th day before the date of the general election, the Secretary
12 of State shall determine [*not less than*] **at least** once each month whether
13 [*the*] registration requirements [*of subsection (4) of this section*] **to maintain**
14 **status as a minor political party** have been satisfied.

15 “(7) If [*the*] **a** minor political party changes its name, only those electors
16 who register on or after the effective date of the name change as members
17 of the party under the new party name shall be counted as members of the
18 party [*under this subsection*].

19 “[*(7)*] **(8)** An affiliation of electors or a minor political party may not
20 **nominate a candidate who is the nominee of another political party**
21 **at the same election in order to** satisfy the one percent requirement re-
22 ferred to in subsection (1)(b) **or (4)(b)(B)** of this section [*by nominating a*
23 *candidate who is the nominee of another political party at the same election*].

24 “[*(8)*] **(9)** For purposes of this section, ‘subsequent general election’ means
25 any general election that is held after the first general election following
26 qualification as a minor political party under subsection (1) of this
27 section.”.

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
