PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 2902

- On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 2, delete "and" and after "743A.036" insert "; and declaring an emergency".
- 3 Delete lines 4 through 23 and insert:
- **"SECTION 1.** ORS 743A.036 is amended to read:
- 5 "743A.036. (1) As used in this section:
- "(a) 'Practicing independently' means providing health care services
 to patients in a setting in which a physician assistant or a nurse
 practitioner is not employed by or working directly with a licensed
 physician.
- 10 "(b) 'Rural and medically underserved area' means an area:
- 11 "(A) That is outside the boundaries of a metropolitan statistical area:
- 13 "(B) That is 30 or more highway miles from the closest hospital 14 within the major population center in a metropolitan statistical area;
- 15 "(C) That is in a county with a population of less than 75,000;
- 16 "(D) That has limited access to telemedicine services; or
- 17 "(E) For which there is evidence that primary care and mental 18 health services are not readily accessible.
- "[(1)] (2) Whenever any [policy of health insurance] health benefit plan
 as defined in ORS 743.730 provides for reimbursement for any service
 [which] that is within the lawful scope of practice of a [duly] licensed
 [and] physician assistant or a certified nurse practitioner, including pre-

- scribing or dispensing drugs, the insured under the policy is entitled to re-
- 2 imbursement for such service whether it is performed by a physician licensed
- 3 by the Oregon Medical Board or by a [duly] licensed physician assistant
- 4 **or certified** nurse practitioner.
- 5 "[(2) This section does not apply to group practice health maintenance or-
- 6 ganizations that are federally qualified pursuant to Title XIII of the Health
- 7 Maintenance Organization Act.]
- 8 "(3) The reimbursement of a service provided by a licensed physi-
- 9 cian assistant or a certified nurse practitioner under subsection (2) of
- this section shall be in an amount that is not less than 85 percent of
- the amount paid under the policy to a licensed physician performing
- the same service in the same geographic area. This subsection does
- 13 not require an insurer to reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed

- 6 "SECTION 2. (1) The Task Force on Access to Primary Care and
- 7 Mental Health Care is established, consisting of 11 members appointed
- 8 as follows:
- 9 "(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from
- among the members of the Senate who shall be a nonvoting member;
- 11 "(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one
- 12 member from among the members of the House of Representatives

- 14 "(c) The Governor shall appoint nine members with expertise in the
- 15 effective delivery of primary care and mental health services in rural

- "(a) Evaluate the nature and scope of access to primary care and mental health services in rural and medically underserved areas of this state;
- "(b) Assess the role of certified nurse practitioners, licensed physician assistants, licensed psychiatrists and licensed primary care physicians in providing access to primary care and mental health services in rural and medically underserved areas of this state; and
- "(c) Report to the 2014 regular session of the Legislative Assembly recommendations for increasing access to primary care and mental health services in rural and medically underserved areas of this state, including but not limited to recommendations regarding insurance reimbursement for services provided by licensed physician assistants and certified nurse practitioners.
 - "(3) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 16 "(4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a 17 majority of the voting members of the task force.
- 18 "(5) The task force shall select one of its members to serve as 19 chairperson.
- 20 "(6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority
 21 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
- "(7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
- 25 "(8) The Oregon Health Authority shall staff the task force.
- 26 "(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

 - "[(2)] (1) Whenever any [health benefit plan as defined in ORS 743.730] policy of health insurance provides for reimbursement for any service that is within the lawful scope of practice of a [licensed physician assistant or a] certified nurse practitioner, including prescribing or dispensing drugs, the insured under the policy is entitled to reimbursement for such service whether it is performed by a physician licensed by the Oregon Medical Board or by a [licensed physician assistant or] certified nurse practitioner.
- "[(3) The reimbursement of a service provided by a licensed physician as-19 sistant or a certified nurse practitioner under subsection (2) of this section 20 shall be in an amount that is not less than 85 percent of the amount paid 21 under the policy to a licensed physician performing the same service in the 22 same geographic area. This subsection does not require an insurer to reduce 23 the reimbursement paid to a licensed physician assistant or a certified nurse 24 practitioner if the reimbursement paid is greater than 85 percent of the amount 25 paid to a licensed physician.] 26
- "[(4) An insurer shall establish:]

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"[(a) Criteria for reimbursing a licensed physician assistant or a certified nurse practitioner under a health benefit plan the same amount as the reimbursement paid to a licensed physician performing the same service in the

- "[(A) Is providing primary care or mental health services; and]

- On page 2, after line 2, insert:
- "SECTION 5. Sections 2 and 4 of this 2013 Act are repealed on July
- 21 **1, 2015.**
- "SECTION 6. The amendments to ORS 743A.036 by section 3 of this
- 23 2013 Act become operative on July 1, 2015.
- 24 "SECTION 7. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate
- 25 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
- declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.".
