

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 33**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon insert “creating
2 new provisions;” and after “401.054” insert “; and declaring an emergency”.

3 On page 2, after line 15, insert:

4 **“SECTION 2. (1) The Task Force on Resilience Plan Implementation**
5 **is established, consisting of the following 16 members:**

6 **“(a) Two members from among members of the Senate appointed**
7 **by the President of the Senate.**

8 **“(b) Two members from among members of the House of Repre-**
9 **sentatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.**

10 **“(c) Seven members appointed by the Governor as follows:**

11 **“(A) One advisor of the Governor on public safety.**

12 **“(B) One advisor of the Governor on regional solutions.**

13 **“(C) One individual recommended by the Association of Oregon**
14 **Counties.**

15 **“(D) One individual recommended by the League of Oregon Cities.**

16 **“(E) One individual representing the scientific community.**

17 **“(F) One individual representing the private business sector.**

18 **“(G) One individual representing the private nonprofit sector.**

19 **“(d) The Adjutant General, or an individual designated by the Ad-**
20 **jutant General.**

21 **“(e) The Director of the Office of Emergency Management or an**
22 **officer or employee of the office designated by the director.**

1 “(f) The chairperson of the Seismic Safety Policy Advisory Com-
2 mission or a member of the commission designated by the chairperson.

3 “(g) The Director of Transportation or another officer or employee
4 of the Department of Transportation designated by the director.

5 “(h) The Public Health Director appointed by the Director of the
6 Oregon Health Authority under ORS 431.035 or another officer or em-
7 ployee of the authority.

8 “(2) The Governor shall select one of the members of the task force
9 to serve as chairperson and one member to serve as vice chairperson.

10 “(3) The task force shall facilitate a comprehensive and robust plan
11 to implement the strategic vision and roadmap of the Oregon
12 Resilience Plan for responding to the consequences of naturally oc-
13 ccurring seismic events associated with geologic shift along the
14 Cascadia subduction zone by making recommendations about:

15 “(a) Education and training of community leaders in emergency
16 management and resilience practices, including:

17 “(A) The development of programs required to significantly improve
18 emergency management knowledge and skills within public, private
19 and private-nonprofit leadership throughout the State of Oregon.

20 “(B) The establishment of integrated curriculum to facilitate
21 emergency management best practices throughout the region that are
22 supported by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

23 “(C) The expansion of outreach and professional development op-
24 portunities for emergency management agencies.

25 “(D) The implementation of a sustainable structure for education
26 and training necessary to facilitate statewide resilience awareness,
27 investment and preparedness.

28 “(E) The establishment of a permanent center of excellence in the
29 State of Oregon for resilience initiatives and research.

30 “(F) The provision of regular updates on emerging education and

1 **training programming opportunities.**

2 **“(b) Coordination of investments in equipment, facilities and sys-**
3 **tems critical for enhanced resilience and survivability in the near,**
4 **intermediate and far terms, including:**

5 **“(A) The facilitation of near-term, intermediate-term, and far-term**
6 **strategic investments of talent, time and moneys in support of estab-**
7 **lished resilience strategies.**

8 **“(B) The implementation of structured, systemic and timely out-**
9 **reach programming targeting public, private and private-nonprofit**
10 **stakeholders.**

11 **“(C) The implementation of targeted public enhancements of crit-**
12 **ical facilities associated with emergency response, public safety re-**
13 **generation and civic restoration standards.**

14 **“(D) The prioritization of state expenditures, including the use of**
15 **moneys in the Education Seismic Fund established in ORS 286A.768**
16 **and the Emergency Services Seismic Fund established in ORS 286A.788.**

17 **“(E) Analysis of international, national and state best practices.**

18 **“(F) The standardization of education and training programming.**

19 **“(4) The chairperson, or the vice chairperson acting in place of the**
20 **chairperson:**

21 **“(a) Shall establish an agenda for the task force.**

22 **“(b) Shall provide leadership and direction to the task force.**

23 **“(c) May establish subcommittees as necessary and may appoint**
24 **individuals who are not members of the task force as members of a**
25 **subcommittee.**

26 **“(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes**
27 **a quorum for the transaction of business.**

28 **“(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a**
29 **majority of the voting members of the task force.**

30 **“(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority**

1 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

2 “(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
3 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the
4 task force.

5 “(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of
6 the task force.

7 “(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided
8 in ORS 192.245, which may include recommendations for legislation,
9 to the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly on or before October 1,
10 2014.

11 “(11) The Oregon Military Department shall provide staff support
12 to the task force.

13 “(12) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation,
14 but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other ex-
15 penses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in
16 the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for ex-
17 penses must be paid out of funds appropriated to Oregon Military De-
18 partment for purposes of the task force.

19 “(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,
20 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties
21 and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to
22 furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider
23 necessary to perform their duties.

24 “SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of
25 the convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly
26 as specified in ORS 171.010.

27 “SECTION 4. The amendments to ORS 401.054 by section 1 of this
28 2013 Act become operative on January 1, 2014.

29 “SECTION 5. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate
30 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is

1 **declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
