

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2691**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “compensation;” delete the rest
2 of the line and insert “creating new provisions; and amending ORS
3 678.031.”.

4 Delete lines 4 through 31 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

5 **“SECTION 1. ORS 678.031 is amended to read:**

6 “678.031. ORS 678.010 to 678.410 do not apply to:

7 “(1) The employment of nurses in institutions or agencies of the federal
8 government.

9 “(2) The practice of nursing incidental to the planned program of study
10 for students enrolled in nursing education programs accredited by the
11 Oregon State Board of Nursing or accredited by another state or United
12 States territory as described under ORS 678.040 and approved by the board.

13 “(3) Nursing practiced outside this state that is incidental to a distance
14 learning program provided by an institution of higher education located in
15 Oregon.

16 “(4) The furnishing of nursing assistance in an emergency.

17 “(5) The practice of any other occupation or profession licensed under the
18 laws of this state.

19 “(6) Care of the sick with or without compensation when performed in
20 connection with the practice of the religious tenets of a well-recognized
21 church or denomination that relies exclusively on treatment by prayer and
22 spiritual means by adherents thereof so long as the adherent does not engage

1 in the practice of nursing as defined in ORS 678.010 to 678.410 and 678.990
2 or hold oneself out as a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse.

3 “(7) Nonresident nurses licensed and in good standing in another state if
4 they are practicing in [*Oregon*] **this state** on a single, temporary assignment
5 of not to exceed 30 days, renewable for not to exceed 30 days, for assignments
6 that are for the general public benefit limited to the following:

7 “(a) Transport teams;

8 “(b) Red Cross Blood Services personnel;

9 “(c) Presentation of educational programs;

10 “(d) Disaster teams;

11 “(e) Staffing a coronary care unit, intensive care unit or emergency de-
12 partment in a hospital that is responding to a temporary staffing shortage
13 and would be otherwise unable to meet its critical care staffing require-
14 ments; or

15 “(f) Staffing a long term care facility that is responding to a temporary
16 staffing shortage and would be otherwise unable to meet its staffing re-
17 quirements.

18 “(8)(a) **Nonresident nurses licensed and in good standing in another**
19 **state if they are practicing in this state without compensation on no**
20 **more than two temporary assignments not to exceed five days in any**
21 **12-month period if the assignments are for the general public benefit.**

22 “(b) **A nonresident nurse practicing under this subsection may not**
23 **prescribe drugs unless the nonresident nurse applies to the board in a**
24 **form and manner prescribed by the board by rule and the board ap-**
25 **proves the application.**

26 “**SECTION 2.** ORS 678.031, as amended by section 1 of this 2013 Act, is
27 amended to read:

28 “678.031. ORS 678.010 to 678.410 do not apply to:

29 “(1) The employment of nurses in institutions or agencies of the federal
30 government.

1 “(2) The practice of nursing incidental to the planned program of study
2 for students enrolled in nursing education programs accredited by the
3 Oregon State Board of Nursing or accredited by another state or United
4 States territory as described under ORS 678.040 and approved by the board.

5 “(3) Nursing practiced outside this state that is incidental to a distance

17 “(7) Nonresident nurses licensed and in good standing in another state if

19 exceed 30 days, renewable for not to exceed 30 days, for assignments that are
20 for the general public benefit limited to the following:

21 “(a) Transport teams;

22 “(b) Red Cross Blood Services personnel;

23 “(c) Presentation of educational programs;

24 “(d) Disaster teams;

25 “(e) Staffing a coronary care unit, intensive care unit or emergency de-
26 partment in a hospital that is responding to a temporary staffing shortage
27 and would be otherwise unable to meet its critical care staffing require-
28 ments; or

29 “(f) Staffing a long term care facility that is responding to a temporary
30 staffing shortage and would be otherwise unable to meet its staffing re-

1 quirements.

2 “[(8)(a) *Nonresident nurses licensed and in good standing in another state*
3 *if they are practicing in this state without compensation on no more than two*
4 *temporary assignments not to exceed five days in any 12-month period if the*
5 *assignments are for the general public benefit.*]

6 “[(b) *A nonresident nurse practicing under this subsection may not pre-*
7 *scribe drugs unless the nonresident nurse applies to the board in a form and*
8 *manner prescribed by the board by rule and the board approves the applica-*
9 *tion.*]

10 **“SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 678.031 by section 2 of this**
11 **2013 Act become operative on January 1, 2020.”.**

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
