

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2667**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 8 and 9 and insert:

2 “(B) One member who is a minority individual or a woman, as those terms
3 are defined in ORS 200.005, who owns or operates a small or local
4 business.”.

5 Delete lines 12 and 13 and insert:

6 “(B) One member who is a minority individual or a woman, as those terms
7 are defined in ORS 200.005, who owns or operates a small or local
8 business.”.

9 Delete lines 15 and 16 and insert:

10 “(A) One member who is a minority individual or a woman, as those terms
11 are defined in ORS 200.005, who owns or operates a small or local
12 business;”.

13 On page 2, delete lines 3 through 10.

14 In line 11, delete “(e)” and insert “(c)”.

15 In line 12, delete the period and insert “; and

16 “(d) Report the results of the study the task force conducts under para-
17 graph (a) of this subsection in a manner that makes comprehensive data
18 about public contracting awards to minority-owned, woman-owned or emerg-
19 ing small businesses in this state visible, understandable and useable and
20 that illuminates the particular impact that contracting agencies’ public
21 contracting practices have on:

22 “(A) Minority-owned businesses, woman-owned businesses and emerging

1 small businesses, each as separate categories of businesses; and
2 “(B) Specific groups of minority individuals who own small or local
3 businesses, including but not limited to individuals who are:
4 “(i) Asian American, as described in ORS 200.005 (4)(c), or Pacific
5 Islander;
6 “(ii) Black, as described in ORS 200.005 (4)(a), or African American;
7 “(iii) Hispanic, as described in ORS 200.005 (4)(b), or Latino;
8 “(iv) Portuguese, as described in ORS 200.005 (4)(d);
9 “(v) American Indian or Alaskan Native, as described in ORS 200.005
10 (4)(e); and
11 “(vi) A member of another group that the Advocate for Minority, Women
12 and Emerging Small Business has determined is socially and economically
13 disadvantaged.”.

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
