

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2406**

1 Delete lines 4 through 27 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 815.220 is amended to read:

3 “815.220. (1) A person commits the offense of obstruction of vehicle win-  
4 dows if the person drives or moves on any highway or owns and causes or  
5 knowingly permits to be driven or moved on any highway any vehicle with  
6 windows obstructed in a manner prohibited under this section.

7 “(2) The windows of a vehicle are obstructed in a manner prohibited by  
8 this section if any material that [*prohibits*] **prevents** or impairs the ability  
9 to see into or out of the vehicle is upon any vehicle window described in this  
10 subsection. This subsection applies to any sign, poster, one-way glass, adhe-  
11 sive film, glaze application or other material if the material [*prohibits*] **pre-**  
12 **vents** or impairs the ability to see into or out of the vehicle. This subsection  
13 only applies to the following windows of the vehicle:

14 “(a) The front windshield.

15 “(b) The side-wings.

16 “(c) The side windows on either side forward of or adjacent to the  
17 operator’s seat.

18 “[*d*] *The rear window.*]

19 “(3) Nothing in this section prohibits safety glazing materials of a type  
20 that conforms to standards established under ORS 815.040.

21 “(4) Nothing in this section prohibits placement of permits in accordance  
22 with the provisions of ORS 803.650 or with rules adopted by the Department

1 of Transportation under ORS 803.650.

2 “(5) Nothing in this section prohibits the application of tinting material  
3 to the windows of a motor vehicle in compliance with ORS 815.221.

4 “(6) The offense described in this section, obstruction of vehicle windows,  
5 is a Class D traffic violation.”.
