HB 4122 Å

Requires state contracting agency or public corporation that implements information technology initiative to obtain, in separate procurement, quality management services from qualified contractor if value of information technology initiative exceeds \$5 million or meets certain other criteria.

HB 4155

Authorizes Public Employees Retirement Board to establish procedures for recovering administrative costs from participating public employers for providing to those employers information or services needed to report in compliance with generally accepted accounting principles.

HB 4156 A

Authorizes Department of Human Services to appear as party in juvenile court proceeding without appearance of Attorney General at any hearing held after hearing on jurisdictional petition required by specified statute, and any proceeding where district attorney represents state and positions of department and state are not in conflict.
