Thank you for your work on the Durable Medical Equipment Bill. I am writing to express my support. I have been a C 4-5 Quadriplegic (paralyzed from the chest down) for over 35 years, and have survived on Medicare / Medicaid. As much as I am greatful for these programs (I may not be here without them) I do get frustrated with some of their rules.

I depend on a motorized wheelchair, a hospital-type bed, and a rolling shower / commode chair for my daily living. Over the years there have been a number of occasions when Medicare / Medicaid has denied the purchase of a replacement for one of these needed appliances - on the grounds that my old piece of equipment was not old enough - though it was rusted-out and dangerous for daily use. The frustrating part was that the local Durable Medical Equipment supplier would regularly discard used (but like-new) wheelchairs or shower chairs because Medicare / Medicaid would not pay for them - being used. The supplier could not afford to just give these perfectly good pieces of equipment away for free - they of course wanted to be paid. So they scrapped them and I went without and did the best I could.

This Durable Medical Equipment Bill - if enacted - will not only help people get the equipment they need for their daily lives, it will also save money and keep good, usable medical equipment from going to the scrapyard.
