The Council strongly supports the need to continue to protect Oregonians from adverse consequences related to problem gambling through a variety of best practices, including policy, implementation, follow-up, and research.

Including the legislature, Oregon Health Authority, Lottery, and community partners, such as the Oregon Council, for example, in designing and monitoring the perceived and actual balance between profitability and all aspects of the public good, will once again place Oregon at the head of the list of responsible states.

The Council's major remaining concern is the looming impact of federally legalized internet/web gambling that may be unthrottled for Oregonians if the state fails to set standards in a timely manner.
