Renewable Northwest Project supports the language contained in House Bill 4126, with the adoption of the -3 amendments.

The bill, amendment and agreements between parties outside of the legislation will:

- 1. Address concerns raised about the application of the RPS to certain utilities in the face of unforeseen energy demands in their jurisdictions,
- 2. Allow, following PUC review and approval, additional flexibility for the sale of green power to certain customers by investor owned utilities under existing statutory authority; and
- 3. Alleviate efforts to change the renewable portfolio stand beyond the scope of what is contained in the amended legislation.
