CITY FOSTERS HOPE

Through programs and housing provided by organizations supported financially through the City's federal funding, such as Catholic Community Services, the City is able to make a difference in the lives of Salem residents like Sonija and her son.

Sonjia grew up in the foster care system. As a teenager, Sonjia moved into one of Catholic Community Services Foundation's (CCSF) Forever Homes. Forever Homes are large townhouses where multiple teenage foster children live with foster parents. Under this program, if the foster parents resign, the children remain in place while new foster parents are brought in. This provides stability in the children's lives. In 2009, the City of Salem provided over \$300,000 of HOME funding to CCSF for a project that incorporated a Forever Home.

After graduating high school, Sonjia moved into Center Court; a place for youth coming out of foster care to live and learn how to enter into adulthood. Gaining the skills necessary to apply for jobs and live on her own, Sonjia was a successful participant in the program. The City of Salem is providing over \$300,000 of HOME funding for transitional housing rehab currently underway at Center Court.

Sonjia was hired by CCSF to assist with their Cars4Kids program. The Cars4Kids program provides an opportunity for the community to donate their vehicle to CCSF. The proceeds of the car sales benefit youth in foster care, youth in need, and vulnerable families in our community.

Sonjia and her son Maddox

Sonjia, a leader of the Fostering Hope Parents Council and a proud mom of son Maddox, works full time, and has a place

to call her own at one of CCSF's new apartments in a caring and nurturing community. In 2008, over \$500,000 of HOME funding was provided by the City of Salem for construction of the apartments.
