CAPITAL REQUEST RATIONALE

- Top three requests represent immediate life safety concerns.
- Other requests address:
 - Life safety issues
 - Deferred maintenance needs
 - Code compliance
 - Student access
 - 40-40-20 goals
 - Emergent opportunities; and
 - Bringing projects to completion



Oregon Tech

FIRST PRIORITY PROJECTS

OIT Utility Tunnel Repair

- Request \$1.1M in state paid Article XI-Q bonds
- Tunnels contain main heating and cooling lines, drinking water lines, high voltage electrical conduits and communications cables
- One section of tunnel has collapsed, added sections are also compromised and in need of repair
- Several fire lanes (above sections of tunnel) are now closed, compromising life safety in event of fire

FIRST PRIORITY PROJECTS

SOU McNeal Hall (built in 1956):

- Request \$21.875M comprised of:
 - \$19.0M State paid Article XI-Q bonds
 - \$2.0M State paid Article XI-M bonds
 - \$0.875M SELP loan (\$300K State paid, bal. from inst.)
- Structural steel failures caused by corrosion poses seismic threat
- Fire and HVAC deficiencies
- Roof replacement necessary
- Fire alarm and sprinklers at failure point

FIRST PRIORITY PROJECTS

UO Utility Tunnel Repair

- Funding request \$2.1M State paid Article XI-Q bonds
- Utility tunnel beneath Franklin Blvd. failing due to deteriorating tunnel walls and intrusion of water
- Tunnel contains high voltage electrical wire, steam, chilled water, network and communications wiring
- Failure will result in major transportation disruption and potential loss of power for nearly one-half of the campus

UO – Chapman Hall (built 1939)

- \$9.5M funding request comprised of:
 - \$2.5M Article XI-G bonds;
 - \$4.5M State paid Article XI-Q bonds; and
 - \$2.5M campus match
- Critical deferred maintenance and seismic issues project
- Home of Clark Honors College
- One of the campus' highest ranking historic buildings
- Has been on UO's "highest priority" list since 2009; ranked #2 in 2013 Session capital list before reprioritization

OIT Fire Alarm System Replacement

- Funding Request \$2.3M State paid Article XI-Q bonds
- Systems in need of replacement as they lack reliability
- Multiple manufactures cause compatibility concerns
- Inability to automatically notify Emergency Fire Services in case of emergency

OSU – Campus Accessibility Improvements

- Funding request \$10M State paid Article XI-Q bonds
- Improvements needed to provide increased safety and access for students/campus – especially for those with physical limitations
- These improvements include immediately creating safer and more accessible paths of travel, and providing critically urgent accessible classroom facilities throughout the OSU Corvallis campus to accommodate all community members
- These improvements will have significant positive impacts for the academic careers of OSU students

OSU – Cascades Academic Building

- Funding request \$3.9M Article XI-G bonds (to be matched by revenue bonds)
- OSU willing to exchange \$4.0M Article XI-G bonds currently authorized for bio-fuels project for this use
- Additional funding needed to construct new academic facilities for Cascades campus in Bend
- This funding would be added to \$20M bonds approved in 2013-15 and \$4M in gifts to purchase land and construct needed academic facilities to open new campus in the fall of 2015

PSU – Renovation for Graduate School of Education

- \$20.0M funding request comprised of:
 - \$3.0M Article XI-G bonds;
 - \$14.0M State paid Article XI-Q bonds; and
 - \$3.0M campus match
- Renovation of current facility required to redress electric and fire suppression deficiencies and add elevator for access to basement and second floor (no elevator now)
- Creates permanent home for Graduate School of Education displaced by Business School expansion, avoiding lease costs

WOU – College of Education Supplemental Funding

- Requesting change in previously approved funding
- From \$1.4M Article XI-G plus \$1.4M campus match to \$2.8M State paid Article XI-Q bonds
- Essential for meeting 40-40-20 goals in education majors 30% of WOU's enrollment
- Includes STEM facility, built to unique needs of deaf/hard of hearing children and adults
- Avoids life safety, seismic and ADA issues in current Education facility
- First project selected for Governor's wood product initiative
- Breaking news request withdrawn due to donor interest in this project

WOU – Acquisition of Oregon Military Academy Facility – Phase 1

- \$5.0 \$8.1M State paid Article XI-Q bond funding request (amount subject to negotiations)
- Facility located in heart of WOU campus
- Oregon Military Department entered in lease for facility in 1991 now indicates a desire to vacate facility
- Phase 1 acquisition; Phase 2 renovate for state of art live/learn facility

COCC – Student Success Center (Cascades Hall renovation)

- This facility is currently leased by OSU-Cascades (lease runs until 2031).
- Due to legislative approval of its 4-year campus in Bend, OSU no longer needs Cascades Hall. Funds currently devoted to the lease are needed to develop the new campus.
- COCC is seeking to renovate Cascades Hall for its Student Success Center.
- During the 2013 session, the Legislature approved \$5.26M in Article XI-G bonds for COCC for this purpose. When matched, these bonds would have generated a total of \$10.52M, more than is needed.
- COCC only needs \$7.26M: \$5.26M to pay off outstanding debt \$2.00M for renovations
- We are requesting the authorization be changed as follows:

Article XI-G bonds	3.63M
Lottery Bonds \$	1.63M
COCC cash for renovations \$	2.00M

\$82.7M FUNDING REQUEST SUMMARY

Top Priority Projects – OIT tunnel, SOU McNeal Hall and UO tunnel - \$25.1M

- \$22.2M State paid Article XI-Q bonds
- \$2.0M State paid Article XI-M bonds
- \$0.875M SELP (\$500K State paid)

Other Important Projects – as listed - \$57.6M

- \$7.95M Article XI-G bonds
- \$41.7M State paid Article XI-Q bonds
- \$7.95M campus match
