SUBJ: **Opposition to SB1575 and SB1578**

1. SB1575 and SB1578 would change current land use laws and bypass the processes that are working well to protect forest, farm, and residential land in Oregon. Industrial businesses, such as log home manufacturing and whole log chipping facilities, were purposely left out of the permitted uses to safeguard lands and neighborhoods. My family and I strongly urge that you not pass these bills out of your committee.
2. My sisters, niece, and I own five lots across Marmot Road from the site leased by Mark Fritch Log Homes from Cooke Group LLC. In 1945 our grandfather, Leonard A. Mathisen, and his partner purchased land located between Marmot Road and the Sandy River. They developed it into 23 waterfront residential home sites, Lenart Acres (see reverse). Most of the homes built along the river are full-time residences, some occupied by families with children. Our great aunt and uncle built their dream retirement home here in 1965.
3. Our grandfather handcrafted our log cabin in 1948 out of timber from his own property using old-fashioned hand tools. He loved fishing in the Sandy River and freely allowed fishermen to fish along our riverbank long before it became State law. He was also proud that Marmot Road is part of the historic Barlow Trail. Friends and family have always enjoyed visiting this tranquil sanctuary.
4. For over six decades I remember our Sandy River cabin as a quiet retreat in the woods. What I don't remember is noise or pollution or anyone concerned about any industrial type enterprise in the area. We understand a timber company built the shop across Marmot Road to repair trucks, a quiet and unobtrusive use of the site currently leased by Mark Fritch.
5. In May 2012 Mr. Fritch began operating his log home building business without a conditional use permit, not only creating excessive noise, but degrading the environment with carcinogenic diesel fumes from heavy equipment and by openly spraying logs with toxic chemicals that may well be entering the Sandy River. Our cabin is no longer an enjoyable or safe place to visit.
6. If SB1575 or SB1578 becomes law, such industrial operations adjacent to residential homes would become permanent throughout Oregon, totally transforming the character of long-established neighborhoods, degrading quality of life, and decimating property values. A very simple solution is to locate industries on appropriate industrial-zoned sites near rural communities that will welcome them.





Photographs are also included to provide a partial overview of the industrial manufacturing site, adjacent residences, and the immediate area.


As stated in my written testimony, such industrial manufacturing operations (manufacturing and building log homes on the adjacent forest-zoned land) have had profound, uncharacteristic, and severe impacts to this Mt. Hood area and river location. Such industrial manufacturing and construction operations are descriptive of and appropriate for Rural-Industrial zoned lands – lands (non-resource lands) specifically zoned for such outdoor industrial uses.

Thank you for your consideration of my concerns and opposition to SB 1575.



SCENIC & DISTINCTION RESOURCE AREAS




Scenic Roads - See Map V-3



* Proposed Site





SAN JUAN DE BOIS**






Sandy Ridge Trail System






Sandy River Location and Sample Affected Streams


