Work Session Recommendations

HB 5202 ratifies fee changes approved by the Department of Administrative Services and adopted administratively by the Construction Contractors Board, the Department of Consumer and Business Services, and the Oregon Health Authority. The measure provides the enabling legislation necessary to approve fees adopted through Administrative Rule.

HB 2845 (2013) was passed allowing owners of self-service storage facilities to apply for a limited license to sell personal property insurance to occupants of self-service storage units. The bill authorized the Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt rules to establish fees, application materials, and requirements for a limited license. The agency adoted rules to establish fees as directed. The fee changes are expected to generate a total of \$4,100 in Other Funds revenue during the 2013-15 biennium.

The Construction Contractors Board established fees for a new continuing education system for residential contractors. The fee changes are expected to generate approximately \$382,360 in additional Other Funds revenue during the 2013-15 biennium.

The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) established two new fees required as a part of new legislation passed in the 2013 Session. HB 3345 requires the regulation of non-transplant anatomical research recovery organizations by OHA. The fee established is expected to generate \$3,500 Other Funds revenue during the 2013-15 biennium. HB 3460 directed OHA to register medical marijuana facilities, and authorized the agency to adopt fees for that purpose. These fees are expected to generate \$1.6 million Other Funds revenue during the 2013-15 biennium.

The Oregon State Public Health Laboratory, a part of OHA, previously had a fee schedule for specific communicable disease tests. They have now adopted the fee schedule for Medicaid fee-for-service. This raises some fees, reduces others, and establishes new fees. The new schedule is expected to generate additional Other Funds revenue of \$950,000 during the 2013-15 biennium.

The measure is recommended to be moved to the Full Committee on Joint Ways and Means.

Motion: I move HB 5202 to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means with a "do pass" recommendation.
