














## **OPPOSE HB 4119**




## Prohibits Price Inquiry on Small Public Architectural & Engineering Projects until Consultant is Selected

HB 4119 disallows price disclosure until late in the process which:

- Creates inefficiencies
- Delays projects if first price is too high
- Increases costs for small public A&E contracts
- Eliminates the option of asking for cost or total hours required
- Mandates a "one size fits all" approach
- Adds no value to smaller and more straight-forward projects
- Removes flexibility & parallel process (see graph)
  - Currently can receive 3 price points at once
  - HB 4119 prohibits price until #1 is chosen
  - If #1 is too high, then must move to #2, then #3 etc.
