## **HB 4143 Abandons the Class**

HB 4143 completely changes how class action settlements and judgments are to be determined in Oregon. The bill repeals longstanding sections of law for class action suits that have protected Oregonians rights for years and would allow courts to impose monetary judgments without identifying specific members of the class entitled to recover. HB 4143 directs proceeds to the coffers of the state, and to the pockets of trial attorneys.

HB 4143 is about loosening the requirements and need to identify class members. It increases the exposure of companies doing business in Oregon. No other state imposes such unlimited risk on its businesses. HB 4143 will have a chilling

effect on business growth and new investment in Oregon.

A trial attorney's dream

This is a boon to trial attorneys who will be awarded a percentage of proceeds from a "generally defined" class, as

percentage of proceeds from a "generally defined" class, as opposed to on behalf of individuals who have actually been harmed, setting the stage for mega-claims and mega-judgments.

While some say HB 4143 is about making sure companies pay the full amount or judgment against them by giving unclaimed funds to the Legal Aid, the legislation goes much further and raises constitutional problems. Oregonians do not want their individual claims resolved by having proceeds going to an entity totally unrelated to those harmed.
