Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis: This bill requires the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to provide expedited titling services at the request of a vehicle dealer if the dealer pays the required fee.

All costs associated with this bill will come out of the Transportation Operating Fund (TOF) and any revenues generated by this bill will be credited to the TOF. The expenses associated with implementing the requirements of the bill are primarily programming changes to the current DMV system. DMV

anticipates being able to absorb the increase in workload with existing resources up to a point and then may need additional resources if the volume of expedited titling requests exceeds a certain amount.

It is important to note that ODOT analyzes all legislation that passes and develops a work plan to complete all the changes together in order to efficiently complete the necessary work. Therefore, while each bill is analyzed for changes as if it were the only change necessary, actual programming time could be reduced due to efficiencies. The Department will develop a work plan to address all computer changes required to conform DMV systems to enacted legislation. The Department will then appear before the Emergency Board, if necessary, during the interim to request an expenditure limitation increase needed to address the required work.
