## **Measure Description:**

Establishes Task Force on Information Technology Project Accountability.

## Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Administrative Services (DAS), Department of Justice, Employment Department, Legislative Assembly, Office of the Governor, Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Secretary of State

## Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

## Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Consumer Protection and Government Efficiency to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

House Bill 403 establishes the 15-member Task Force on Information Technology Project Accountability charged with conducting audits, investigations, examinations and other reviews of troubled or failed state information technology projects to garner lessons learned. The task force is required to seek the opinions and recommendations of experts for procurement, contract administration, and quality as well as project management in order to recommend changes to state practices regarding the implementation of information technology projects.

This bill is anticipated to have a fiscal impact on the Department of Administrative Services (DAS), the Department of Justice, the Employment Department, the Legislative Assembly, the Office of the Governor, the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Oregon Health Authority (OHA), and the Secretary of State.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
