Measure Description:

Permits Warm Springs to dedicate a Memorial Highway and allows 100% disabled vets to pay discounted fee for annual medical marijuana card currently available to assistance recipients.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), Oregon Health Authority (OHA)

Analysis:

The proposed legislation has been determined to have
MINIMAL EXPENDITURE IMPACT
on state or local government.

While this individual measure has a “Minimal” fiscal impact, an agency may incur a net fiscal impact greater than minimal depending on the cumulative impact of all measures enacted into law that affect the agency.

The fiscal impact of this measure, as amended, is representative of standard incremental cost increases to the affected agencies; therefore the Legislative Fiscal Office recommends rescinding the subsequent referral to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. Such consideration only becomes warranted when the cumulative fiscal impact of multiple measures of a similar nature begins to materially affect an agency’s budget and its ability to fulfill its statutory responsibilities.
