**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Amends 40-40-20 education goals, contained in ORS 351.009, to include apprenticeship programs registered with State Apprenticeship and Training Council.

MEASURE: HB 4058 A

CARRIER: Sen. Knopp

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Needs of workforce in skilled trades
- Importance of raising awareness of apprenticeship opportunities
- Intent of original legislation to include apprenticeship programs in 40-40-20 goals
- Large volume of current skilled tradespeople projected to retire soon

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Moves operative language to separate subsection of ORS 351.009.

**BACKGROUND:** Senate Bill 253 (2011) revised Oregon's goals for post-secondary education to provide that by 2025: at least 40 percent of adult Oregonians will have earned a bachelor's degree or higher; at least 40 percent will have earned an associate's degree or post-secondary credential; and the remaining 20 percent or fewer will have earned a high school diploma or equivalent as their highest level of educational attainment. This goal is frequently abbreviated to 40-40-20. House Bill 4058A adds completion of apprenticeship programs registered with the State Apprenticeship and Training Council to the middle 40 percent, along with associate's degrees and professional credentials.
