The office shall provide the report to the Legislative Assembly as provided in ORS 192.245. The report must contain information regarding: 26 27"(a) The number and circumstances of requests received, by public safety answering point and 28by law enforcement agency, to disclose the call location information for a cellular device reasonably 29believed to be in the possession of an individual that the law enforcement agency reasonably believes is in an emergency situation that involves the risk of death or serious physical harm to the 30 31 individual. 32(b) Analysis of any circumstances in which the receipt of information described in paragraph 33 (a) of this subsection is not provided at all or not provided in a timely manner.". 34 After line 30, insert: "SECTION 3. ORS 403.135 is amended to read: 35

1 "403.135. (1) Each telecommunications utility that provides exchange access service or radio 2 communications service and that provides automatic number identification to public safety answer-3 ing points may not block the number of the calling party from being forwarded on 9-1-1 calls.

4 "(2) Automatic number identifications received by public safety answering points are confidential and are not subject to public disclosure unless and until an official report is written by the 5 public or private safety agency and that agency does not withhold the telephone number under ORS 6 7 192.410 to 192.505 or other state and federal laws. The official report of a public safety answering 8 point may not include nonpublished or nonlisted telephone numbers. The official report of a public or private safety agency may not include nonpublished or nonlisted telephone numbers. Nonpub-9 lished or nonlisted telephone numbers are not otherwise subject to public disclosure without the 10 11 permission of the subscriber.

"(3) A provider is not subject to an action for civil damages for providing in good faith confidential or nonpublic information, including nonpublished and nonlisted subscriber information, to emergency services providers who are:

15 "(a) Responding to emergency calls placed to a 9-1-1 emergency reporting system;

"(b) Responding to emergency situations that involve the risk of death or serious physical
 harm to an individual, as provided in section 2 of this 2014 Act; or

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"(c) Notifying the public of an emergency. [This]

"(4) Subsection (3) of this section does not compel a provider to provide nonpublished and nonlisted subscriber information directly to emergency services providers or law enforcement agencies prior to placement of an emergency call to a 9-1-1 emergency reporting system without process of law.

"(5) Subscriber information acquired by a 9-1-1 jurisdiction for the purpose of enhancing a 9-1-1
 emergency reporting system is not subject to public disclosure and may not be used by other public
 agencies except:

26 "(a) To respond to a 9-1-1 call;

"(b) To respond to an emergency situation that involves the risk of death or serious
physical harm to an individual, as provided in section 2 of this 2014 Act; or

29 "[(b)] (c) To notify the public of an emergency by utilizing an automated telephone notification 30 system if a provider has provided subscriber information to the 9-1-1 jurisdiction or emergency ser-31 vices provider.".

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
