

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4023

- 1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete “appropriating money;”.
- 2 After line 2, insert:
- 3 “Whereas the Warm Springs Reservation was founded by the Treaty with the Tribes of Middle
4 Oregon, 12 Stat. 963 (1855); and
- 5 “Whereas the sovereign tribes and bands, now recognized as the Confederated Tribes of the
6 Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon, have continued to operate, governing under a constitutional
7 form of government; and
- 8 “Whereas veterans who are members of the Confederated Tribes have served the United States
9 of America with distinction and honor and have made willing sacrifices during our nation’s wars,
10 conflicts and national security missions dating to the Early Indian Wars of Oregon; and
- 11 “Whereas the State of Oregon has honored veterans, including veterans of foreign wars, with
12 honorific signs on U.S. Highway 97, Interstate 84, Interstate 205, State Highway 126 and State
13 Highway 62 as a tribute to all of the men and women who have answered our nation’s call to mili-
14 tary service; and
- 15 “Whereas the State of Oregon has not designated any highway in Oregon to honor the unique
16 history and heritage of veterans of the Confederated Tribes since the founding of the Warm Springs
17 Reservation; and
- 18 “Whereas an approximately 35-mile section of U.S. Highway 26, which traverses the Warm
19 Springs Reservation, lies within a right of way granted by the United States in accordance with 25
20 U.S.C. 311 and is not named for or designated to honor any veteran; and
- 21 “Whereas an honorary designation of the portion of U.S. Highway 26 that traverses the Warm
22 Springs Reservation does not require a change in the name or designation of the highway; and
- 23 “Whereas The Museum at Warm Springs on U.S. Highway 26 contains memorials and displays
24 commemorating a call to serve our nation in the defense of peace, freedom and vital national in-
25 terests by veterans who are members of the Confederated Tribes; and
- 26 “Whereas 499 veterans who are members of the Confederated Tribes are listed as having an-
27 swered our nation’s call to duty and served with honor, dedication and selfless conviction, and some
28 of those veterans made the supreme sacrifice, giving their lives in defense of our nation during the
29 following eras of armed hostilities and related missions:
- 30 “Early Indian Wars of Oregon (Modoc and Snake Indian Wars) - 97;
- 31 “World War I - 14;
- 32 “World War II - 114;
- 33 “Korean War - 97;
- 34 “Vietnam War - 107;
- 35 “Global War on Terrorism - 70; and

1 “Whereas Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4217 in Warm Springs is named in honor of Elliott
2 Palmer, an Army veteran killed during World War II; and

3 “Whereas American Legion Post 48 is named in honor of Eugene A. ‘Cougar’ Greene Sr., a dis-
4 tinguished recipient of the Army Silver Star, which he earned in the Korean War for conspicuous
5 courage under enemy fire; and

6 “Whereas designation of U.S. Highway 26 as the Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway
7 will preserve and foster a sense of patriotism and honor the enduring warrior spirit for all tribal
8 veterans and their families, tribal members, all military veterans and highway travelers; and

9 “Whereas the Warm Springs community and veterans have offered to pay for the design, fabri-
10 cation, installation and maintenance of signs meeting standards of the Department of Transportation
11 without cost to taxpayers or the State of Oregon; now, therefore,”.

12 Delete lines 4 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:

13 “**SECTION 1. (1) The portion of U.S. Highway 26 within the Warm Springs Reservation**
14 **shall be known as the Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway.**

15 “**(2) The Department of Transportation shall place and maintain suitable markers along**
16 **the highway described in this section that indicate the designation of the highway as the**
17 **Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway.**

18 “**(3)(a) The department may accept moneys from, and may enter into agreements with,**
19 **veterans groups to create, install and maintain the markers.**

20 “**(b) The department may not use public funds for the installation and maintenance of the**
21 **markers.**

22 “**SECTION 2. Section 3 of this 2014 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 475.300 to**
23 **475.346.**

24 “**SECTION 3. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall reduce the amount of the fee de-**
25 **scribed in ORS 475.309 (2) by an amount described in subsection (2) of this section for a**
26 **person who provides the authority, at the time of applying for a registry identification card,**
27 **with proof that the person is a veteran who has received a disability rating of 100 percent**
28 **from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.**

29 “**(2) The discount described in subsection (1) of this section is equal to the greatest re-**
30 **duction in the amount of the fee established by the authority as described in ORS 475.309 (2)**
31 **that is available to a person who provides the authority, at the time of applying for a registry**
32 **identification card, with proof that the person receives a form of assistance payment from**
33 **the state or federal government.**

34 “**SECTION 4. This 2014 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
35 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2014 Act takes effect**
36 **on its passage.”.**
