House Bill 4027

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

6	SECTION 1. ORS 359.010 is amended to read:
7	359.010. As used in ORS 359.010 to 359.137, unless the context requires otherwise:
8	(1) "Administrator" means the Administrator of the Arts Program of the [Oregon Business De-
9	velopment Department]
10	(2) "Arts" includes, but is not limited to, instrumental and vocal music; dance, drama, folk art,
11	creative writing and poetry; architecture and landscaping design and the fields allied to them;
12	painting, sculpture, photography; graphic and craft arts; industrial design; costume and fashion de-
13	sign; motion pictures, television, radio; tape and sound recording; the history, criticism, theory and
14	practice of the arts; and the arts related to the presentation, performance, execution and exhibition
15	of such art forms.
16	(3) "Association" means a nonprofit, private, incorporated or unincorporated institution, foun-
17	dation, museum, organization, society or group, whether local, state, regional or national, that is
18	operating, or doing business, in Oregon.
19	(4) "Commission" means the Oregon Arts Commission.
20	(5) "Department" means the [Oregon Business Development Department]
21	(6) "Director" means the Director of the [Oregon Business Development Department]
22	(7) "Program" means the Arts Program of the [Oregon Business Development Department]

24	(8) "Local agencies" includes cities, counties and other public corporations and their officers,
25	boards and commissions.
26	(9) "Public agencies" means state agencies and local agencies.
27	(10) "Private corporation" means a corporation organized for profit and authorized to do busi-
28	ness in this state.
29	(11) "State agencies" includes state officers, departments, boards and commissions.
30	SECTION 2. ORS 359.020 is amended to read:
31	359.020. (1) The Oregon Arts Commission is created as a policy-making and advisory body within

the [Oregon Business Development Department] _____. The commission shall consist of nine mem-1 bers appointed by the Governor. The term of a member is four years, and the member shall serve 2 until a successor is appointed and qualifies. 3 (2) Persons appointed members of the commission shall be [citizens] residents of Oregon well 4 qualified by experience to make policy and recommendations in areas of concern to the Arts Pro-5 gram of the [Oregon Business Development Department] _____ and otherwise to perform the duties 6 of the office. 7 (3) In case of a vacancy on the commission for any cause, the Governor shall appoint a succes-8 9 sor to serve for the unexpired term. 10 (4) A member of the commission may be appointed to serve two consecutive terms. (2) To encourage and give greater opportunities and recognition to individual Oregon artists 3 whose work is, or gives promise of being, of high quality. 4 (3) To stimulate and encourage private and local initiative and financial support in connection 5 with programs and activities in the arts. 6 SECTION 5. ORS 359.040 is amended to read: 7 359.040. To carry out its objectives the Arts Program of the [Oregon Business Development De-8 9 partment] ______ shall: (1) Develop programs and plans: 10 (a) To encourage broad public participation in, and understanding of, programs in the arts. 11 12 (b) To encourage public interest in conserving and understanding the cultural and artistic her-13 itage of the state and of its people. (1) In performing its duties, the Arts Program of the [Oregon Business Development 41 _____, within the limits of available funds, may: 42 Department] (a) Conduct hearings and conferences to develop facts, to explain programs and activities, and 43 to obtain advice. 44 (b) Enter into agreements with other public agencies and with associations and individuals for 45

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services that will assist the Oregon Arts Commission or the Trust for Cultural Development Board.
 (c) Enter into agreements with other public agencies of Oregon or with agencies of other states
 or the federal government, and with private corporations, associations and individuals in Oregon or
 other states for cooperative endeavors which further the objectives and programs of the commission.
 (d) Make grants to local agencies, to associations or to individuals for the development and
 conservation of programs in the arts, such grants to be made in accordance with policies and pro cedures adopted by the commission.

15 359.065. (1) The Arts Program is established as an administrative section within the [Oregon 16 Business Development Department] _____. The program is subject to the supervision of the Ad-17 ministrator of the Arts Program. The program shall consist of the administrator and all personnel 18 employed in the program.

(2) The program shall employ, in accordance with the State Personnel Relations Law, the
 staff necessary to allow the program to carry out the provisions of ORS 359.010 to 359.137.

21 [(2)] (3) The program shall provide the Oregon Arts Commission with staff and other assistance 22 as necessary for the commission to perform its duties.

SECTION 9. ORS 359.110 is amended to read:

(1) The Arts Program of the [Oregon Business Development Department] _____ may 34 solicit and accept gifts, bequests or devises of money, securities or other property of whatever 35 character to carry out the purposes of ORS 359.010 to 359.137. A restricted gift, bequest or devise 36 shall not be accepted if such restriction would be contrary to the laws of this state.

(2) The program shall be the custodian of any securities or other property accepted as a gift, bequest or devise. The program shall hold such property as trustee for the state and shall conserve and administer such property to carry out the purposes of ORS 359.010 to 359.137. Except as prohibited by law or restricted by the terms of the gift, bequest or devise, the program may sell or exchange any property accepted as a gift, bequest or devise as it may from time to time determine. The income from such money, securities or other property shall be credited to the Arts Trust Account established by ORS 359.120.

ORS 359.405 is amended to read: 359.405. (1) The Trust for Cultural Development Account is established in the State Treasury, 28separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned by the Trust for Cultural Development 2930 Account shall be credited to the account. The primary purpose of the account is to serve as a re-31 pository for both public and private moneys designated to fund specific arts, heritage and humanities 32programs. (2) All moneys in the Trust for Cultural Development Account are appropriated continuously to 33 34 the [Oregon Business Development Department] ______ for the Arts Program for the purposes of ORS 359.400 to 359.444. 35SECTION 15. ORS 276.090 is amended to read: 36 37 276.090. (1) The Arts Program of the [Oregon Business Development Department] ______ and the 38 Oregon Department of Administrative Services, if the construction project is located within the area

described in ORS 276.054, and the Arts Program of the [Oregon Business Development Department] , the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and the contracting agency if the project is located outside the area described in ORS 276.054, in consultation with the architect for the particular building shall determine the amount available for each state building and shall commission by contract or shall purchase suitable works of art for each building. The agencies designated by this section are solely responsible for selection, review of design, execution, placement and acceptance of works of art acquired pursuant to ORS 276.073 to 276.090. The designated agencies,

1 to the extent reasonable, shall consult with appropriate local citizens groups and the occupants of

(1) In carrying out the duties of the Director of the Oregon Department of Administra-14 15 tive Services under ORS 276.095, the director shall consult with the Capitol Planning Commission, the designated State Historic Preservation Officer, the State Parks and Recreation Department, the 16 Oregon Historical Society, the Arts Program of the [Oregon Business Development Department] 17 _, local landmark commissions and historic societies and the chief executive officers of those 18 19 units of local government in each area served by existing or proposed state offices and shall solicit the comments of other community leaders and members of the general public that the director con-2021siders appropriate.

(2) Whenever the director undertakes a review of state building needs within a geographical area, the director shall request the cooperation of the state historic preservation officer to identify an existing building within the geographical areas that is of historical, architectural or cultural significance and that is suitable, whether or not in need of repair, alteration or addition, for acquisition or purchase to meet the building needs of state government.
