House Bill 4043

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Energy and Environment)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Restricts use of electricity by electric cooperative if facility generating electricity emits amount of greenhouse gases per megawatt-hour greater than any generating facility that generates electricity distributed or sold by Bonneville Power Administration.

Becomes operative on date that Initiative Petition 3 (2014) becomes effective. Becomes operative only if Initiative Petition 3 (2014) becomes law.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to utilities; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2014 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 757.522 to 757.536.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding ORS 757.528 and 757.533, the governing board of an electric cooperative may not:

- (1) Invest in a generating facility if the generating facility emits more pounds of greenhouse gases per megawatt-hour than any generating facility that generates electricity distributed or sold by the Bonneville Power Administration;
- (2) Contract for the acquisition of electricity if any generating facility that generates the electricity emits more pounds of greenhouse gases per megawatt-hour than any generating facility that generates electricity distributed or sold by the Bonneville Power Administration; or
- (3) Use a third party to procure electricity for the electric cooperative if any generating facility that generates the electricity emits more pounds of greenhouse gases per megawatt-hour than any generating facility that generates electricity distributed or sold by the Bonneville Power Administration.
- <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, sections 1 and 2 of this 2014 Act become operative on the date that Initiative Petition 3 (2014) becomes effective.
- (2) Sections 1 and 2 of this 2014 Act become operative only if Initiative Petition 3 (2014) becomes law.
- <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2014 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2014 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
