House Bill 4075

Sponsored by Representative JENSON; Representatives BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, HUFFMAN, KENNEMER, OLSON, SPRENGER, WEIDNER, WHISNANT (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Authorizes certain hunters to use battery-powered scoping devices, laser sighting devices and pin sight lights to hunt. Allows person to accompany person with disability to assist with hunting activities.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to hunting; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 498.142 and 498.170.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1.** ORS 498.142 is amended to read:
- 5 498.142. (1) Except as provided in [subsection (2)] subsections (2) and (3) of this section, [no 6 person shall] a person may not hunt wildlife with the aid of any artificial light.
 - (2) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission, by rule, may authorize hunting with the aid of an artificial light for the purpose of taking raccoon, opossum or bobcat or to alleviate damage by wildlife to other resources.
 - (3) A person with a disability who is lawfully hunting and is accompanied by a person as described in ORS 498.170 may:
 - (a) Use a battery-powered scoping device that projects a light or dot inside the scoping device on a firearm when hunting.
 - (b) Use a laser sighting device on a bow or on a firearm when hunting.
 - (c) Use a pin sight light on a bow when hunting.
- SECTION 2. ORS 498.170 is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 498.
- SECTION 3. ORS 498.170 is amended to read:
- 498.170. (1) A person [who does not have a visual impairment and] who accompanies a [hunter who possesses a visually impaired hunter license] person with a disability who is lawfully hunting may:
 - (a) Assist the [hunter] person with a disability in selecting a game animal or bird;
 - (b) Assist the **person with a disability in the** aiming or sighting of a firearm **or a bow and** arrow:
 - (c) Advise the [hunter] person with a disability when to fire a firearm or shoot a bow and arrow;
- 26 (d) Shoot a game animal or bird on behalf of the [hunter] person with a disability while in the 27 immediate presence of the [hunter] person with a disability; and
 - (e) Tag and retrieve game animals and birds on behalf of the [hunter] person with a disability.
 - (2) [The] A person accompanying a [hunter who has a visual impairment] person with a disa-

bility who is lawfully hunting:

- (a) Shall be required to possess a valid hunting license[. The person accompanying a hunter who has a visual impairment]; and
- (b) May [also] hunt game animals or birds if the person possesses the appropriate tags, permits and stamps for the area and time period.
- (3) A [hunter who possesses a visually impaired hunter license] person with a disability who is hunting with the assistance of another person pursuant to this section must comply with all [other] license, tag, permit and stamp requirements of the State Fish and Wildlife Commission and applicable hunting laws.
- [(4) As used in this section, "hunter who has a visual impairment" means a person who files proof with the commission that the person's central visual acuity does not exceed 20/200 in the better eye with best correction or that the person's visual acuity, if better than 20/200, is accompanied by a limit to the field of vision to such a degree that its widest diameter subtends an angle of no greater than 20 degrees.]
